### 4. Details of our assessment

This Compliance Assessment Report follows a review of Quarter 2 (April – June 2021) air emissions monitoring.

CEMS reports were submitted in accordance with Condition 4.1.2, however as a result of errors highlighted in previous CAR forms NRW requested all CEMS data for 2021 be resubmitted by the 28 February 2022. Following a further extension request the data was submitted on 9 March 2022.

NRW had requested the 2021 data be resubmitted having identified that the QAL2 calibration function had not been applied and that some readings were being excluded incorrectly.

The Part A / B accompanying the resubmitted data states that there are 87 occurrences where ELVs were exceeded during 2021. The Operator has subsequently stated that this is for the period August to December 2021.

Having reviewed the data submitted the following ELV breaches have been identified for Q2. Exceedances across the quarter have been consolidated per parameter. NRW have not received any Part C Abnormal Operation notifications for the quarter. The Abnormal Operations log was submitted on the 11 March 2022, this identifies 1 occasion during Q2 when Abnormal Operations were identified. There are no Invalid Days highlighted on this spreadsheet.

Particulate matter - exceedances of the ½ hour average ELV of 30mg/m<sup>3</sup> have been identified. **This has been scored a CCS3 breach of Condition 2.2.1.3.** There were no breaches of the daily average ELV of 10mg/m<sup>3</sup>.

VOC - exceedances of the ½ hour average ELV of 20mg/m<sup>3</sup> have been identified. **This has been scored a CCS3 breach of Condition 2.2.1.3.** There were no breaches of the daily average ELV of 10mg/m<sup>3</sup>.

Hydrogen Chloride - exceedances of the daily average ELV of 10mg/m<sup>3</sup> have been identified. **This has been scored a CCS3 breach of Condition 2.2.1.3.** There were no breaches of the ½ hour average ELV of 60mg/m<sup>3</sup>.

Sulphur dioxide - exceedances of the ½ hour average ELV of 200mg/m<sup>3</sup> have been identified. **This has been scored a CCS3 breach of Condition 2.2.1.3.** There were no

breaches of the daily average ELV of 50mg/m<sup>3</sup>.

There were no breaches of carbon monoxide above the 10 min average ELV of 150mg/m<sup>3</sup> or the daily average ELV of 30mg/m<sup>3</sup>. There were no breaches of NOX above the daily average ELV of 400mg/m<sup>3</sup>.

Notifications were not received for any ELV exceedances in Q2. **This has been scored a CCS4 breach of Condition 5.1.1 and 5.1.2 - failure to notify.**

This CAR form (and the others relating to CEM exceedances for 2021) highlight a significant number of exceedances above the CEM emission limit values. The root cause of these do not appear to have been investigated by the Operator or any improvements highlighted to ensure compliance with the permit conditions.

**Action: The Operator shall provide NRW with a thorough investigation into the root cause of emission exceedances during 2021, including a review of the abatement system performance and its maintenance. Timescales shall be provided to NRW for any improvements highlighted. An update should be provided to NRW by 30 April 2022.**

**Action: Ensure Schedule Notifications are submitted to NRW immediately after becoming aware of any ELV breaches. This should be implemented immediately.**

The Operator has stated that the QAL2 calibration functions have been applied to the data following the QAL2 monitoring in February and June 2021. This was completed following a site visit on 19 January 2022.

**Action: The Operator should ensure that their procedures reflect the requirement to update the calibration functions within a maximum of 6 weeks of the QAL2. Please send NRW your revised procedures by 30 April 2022.**

Having reviewed the data it appears there are some inconsistencies with the application of Abnormal Operations and Invalid Days. No Invalid Days are identified within the Abnormal Operations log.

**Action: The Operator needs to confirm their understanding and interpretation of Abnormal Operations and Invalid Days and how they have been applied to the data. Please provide an explanation by 30 April 2022.**

Due to the concerns highlighted in this CAR we are considering our enforcement response. Future audits of the site are likely to focus on the aspects identified within this CAR.
