Site audit carried out by Ella Williams on the de-pollution process and the technically competent manager requirement of the permit.

Met with Malcolm Harrison on site. Site was found to be clean and tidy at time of visit. Weather was dry and sunny.

Consignment Notes

Consignment notes were checked and were present and correct.

De-pollution process

A Daewoo Matiz was witnessed being de-polluted during the audit. Airbags are removed whole and resold. Engines are removed whole and the oil filter kept on at this point. These engines are stored on impermeable surface that are served by the interceptor. If the engines are not sold, the oil filters are then removed and the engines scrapped. Oil filter bin was checked to confirm this. Tyres are removed and sold as part-worns or scrapped as necessary. Whilst the Daewoo did not have air con, air con equipment was found to be on site and gas is extracted and re-used in the garage that is also on site. Shocks were not de-polluted, again liquid is kept in them and to be sold, are stored on impermeable surface and if finally scrapped are drained then. All other liquids and parts were drained and/or removed in a compliant
