Environment officers Laoni Tye and Lara Moggridge visited site on the 9th March 2016 and met with Steve Nichol and Joe Gatley. The purpose of the visit was to discuss comments and queries from the previous CAR forms. Please see the areas of discussion below:

WAC test results

We discussed the recent results from the WAC test you conducted in Feb 2016 which all fall below that of the requirements for inert material. However as discussed, although the results show the waste to be of a low risk it does not ultimately change the waste and it should not be classed as inert. The waste is not deemed as hazardous and it can therefore be deposited at a non-hazardous landfill but not an inert landfill.

Action: Please ensure all waste is disposed of correctly in line with the guidance provided on street sweepings. No waste derived from street sweepings should be classed as inert or disposed of at inert landfill unless it undergoes further treatment.

Street sweepings guidance

As previously advised de-watering alone does not change the characteristics of the waste. It would need to go through biological/mechanical/physical treatment which would result in a change of the characteristics i.e would recover various fractions such as grit, stones and sand.

Following the guidance on the recovery of road sweepings and gully emptyings there is a potential that these can be treated by mechanical and/or biological treatment processes to recover various fractions such as grit, sand and stones. The recovered material could potentially fall under EWC code 19 'wastes from the mechanical treatment of waste (for example sorting, crushing, compacting, pelletising) not otherwise specified'. For example 19 12 11* other wastes (including mixtures of materials) from mechanical treatment of waste containing dangerous substances and/or 19 12 09 minerals for example sand and stone, could potentially be used.

If you disagree with this guidance and you wish to discuss it please formulate something in writing outlining your reasoning and any evidence you have to support this. We will pass the information on to the relevant team who will be able to discuss this with you further. **In the meantime this guidance has been accepted as best practice and it will need to be followed.**

Waste coding

You advised us that you do not agree that incoming waste should be coded as 200303 'Street-cleaning residues'. We have discussed this with the relevant teams and have agreed that it is the correct coding for the waste you collect. Although it is collected from construction sites rather than roads/highways there is still the potential for other contaminants to be present such as oils and heavy metals. It is difficult to

guarantee the types of waste that will be swept up which is why it should be classed as ‘street-cleaning residues’

However, it is ultimately the producer’s responsibility to correctly classify the waste with the EWC code and description. If you wish to accept different waste codes you will need to apply to vary your permit as you are currently only permitted to accept waste code 20 03 03 – this applies to all incoming and outgoing waste. You will need to provide us with evidence and justification for any changes or additional waste codes required.

Action: You must ensure waste is correctly coded as 20 03 03 when incoming and outgoing from site. Failure to do so may lead to a permit breach in the future.

Water samples

We took a water sample at the end of the visit. We are still waiting for the results to come back and we will update you at a later date with our findings.
