Tony Bruten attended the site at 10:00 hrs on Friday 7th October 2016. On arrival at the site 2 skips full of waste were being stored outside the site on the public highway.

You must ensure that no waste is stored outside the permitted area, failure to comply may result in a breach of one or more conditions of your permit.

On site there had been a slight increase of waste stored since the previous visit and although this did not at this time breach the total volume allowed on site under the permit advice and guidance was given to avoid any further increase in waste. It has been noted that shortly after the inspection waste was removed from the site thus reducing the overall amount on site.

One cause for concern is the continuing cancellation of a person to sit the WAMITAB Continuing Competency.

As a result you have been breached under C2. This is a breach of permit condition 1.4.1. This requires that *Whenever the site is open to receive or dispatch waste, or is carrying out any of the specified waste management treatment or disposal operations, it shall be supervised by at least one member of staff who is suitably trained and fully conversant with the requirements of the licence and the working plan.*

To ensure compliance with your permit and to avoid further non-compliance you must ensure that a person on your site is qualified as a Technically Competent person.

There have been at least 5 cancellations of exam dates with WAMITAB to sit the Continuing Competency since I have been your site officer. You must ensure that you have a suitably qualified person on site by 31st October 2016, failure to comply could result in further enforcement action being taken.

Further to your permitted site I will also mention the area covered by the S2 exemption which is situated alongside the permitted area. This area is exempt to store certain waste sorted waste types under conditions of that exemption, you must ensure compliance with those conditions.
