Bespoke permit

We have decided to grant the permit for Unit 21 Caerwent Army Training Estate operated by Mr Simon Stone

The permit number is EPR/NB3597TA

We consider in reaching that decision we have taken into account all relevant considerations and legal requirements and that the permit will ensure that the appropriate level of environmental protection is provided.
