Regulatory officers Rhys Ellis and Andrew Sowerby visited the site in relation to odour complaints in the Pinfold Lane area that Natural Resources Wales received.

Brookhill Landfill site and associated waste transfer pad were amongst some of the locations visited.

D1.Site security

During the visit there were no Flintshire County Council personnel on site, there was a lorry driver briefly on site during our visit and also a subcontractor tankering leachate.

It was noted that the gates for both gas engine and flare compound were open during the visit. These are 2 critical aspects of site which had inadequate security to prevent unauthorised access.

The current security status of the site demonstrates that the Environment management system (EMS) and associated measures on site are inadequate to avoid and minimise the risk of unauthorised access to key equipment on site (i.e to prevent vandalism and manipulation of equipment that could result in an unauthorised emission). As a result condition 1.1.1 of your permit is breached and a CCS score of 3 is applied.

Natural Resources Wales were subsequently advised that the site is considering installing combination locks on the gas engine and flare compound.

You must take a risk-based approach to decide the level of security needed on site to prevent unauthorised access. What is appropriate will depend upon the environmental risks posed by the activity itself and the location. You need to be clear about the level of security needed at your site and make a written assessment of your control measures in your management system.

Please can you confirm actions taken to improve site security and update your EMS accordingly and submit your revised procedure no later than 27th November 2017.

Site drainage.

E2- Emission to ground.

It was noted during the inspection that there was evidence that contaminated runoff from the lower waste transfer pad had overflowed to surrounding ground (as per photograph 4 and 5 below).

Condition 3.1.1 stipulates that there should be no point source emissions to land except from the sources and emissions listed in schedule 3 tables S3.2 and S3.3.

As a result of unauthorised discharge of contaminated water to ground a CCS score of 3 has been applied.

During a subsequent conversation on the 4th October 2017 Natural Resources Wales were advised that the site plan to install an automatic flow pump at the lower transfer pad which would pump contaminated water into the leachate plant. Please can the site update Natural Resources Wales on progress in relation to this matter no later than 27th November 2017. It would also be advisable for the Environment management system to be updated to reflect this and to include details of routine checks and maintenance on the pump including contingency measures in the event of the pump failing and adverse weather (i.e heavy rainfall) etc.

Natural Resources Wales have also been advised that improvements are planned for containment of contaminated water at another location above the canteen (See photograph 6 below) .

Please can the site provide an update to Natural Resources Wales on this matter by no later than 27th November 2017

F1-Amenity – Odour.

F4 – Amenity – Pests,birds and scavengers

An odour was detected on site, mainly deriving from the waste food storage skips and the effluent seeping from the skips which could cause annoyance off site if the situation was to worsen.

It was noted during the visit that some of the skips did not have the sheeting over them in order to try and minimise odour (Photograph 7). Please ensure that all food waste skips on site are covered at all times and that all appropriate measures, including, but not limited to, those specified in any approved odour management plan, to prevent or where that is not practicable to minimise the odour.

Sheeting also helps to prevent attracting birds and minimise the presence of pests on the site. It was noted during the visit that a couple of seagulls were taking an interest in the food waste.

You should also ensure that any leaks and spillages are prevented wherever possible and any spillages contained and dealt with appropriately.
