4. Details of our assessment

This was an unannounced site inspection by Hazardous Waste Regulation Officer, Kathryn Bradshaw accompanied by Waste Regulation Officer, Boguslaw Pierzchala. The weather was dry and sunny with little wind. At the entrance to the site there is a site identification board which is out of date and refers to the Environment Agency with the incorrect contact number. This needs updating as per section 3.1 of your permit.

We were met on site by Andrew Brown, the owner of the site. The site was very busy and we witnessed several small trucks arriving and depositing waste as well as a large 8 wheeler tipping soils. This vehicle was owned by Brown's skips.

The site appeared very disorganised and untidy with no clear waste segregation. The site did have perimeter fencing and 24 hour remotely monitored CCTV.

Loads are tipped into an area then sorted by hand into different waste streams such as soils, rubble, scrap metal, tyres, hard plastics and UPVC frames.

There is a machine on site that is used to separate the tyres from the metal wheels and a T8 waste exemption has been registered to cover this activity.

The site is very compact with minimal room for storage and processing. There was a pool of standing water in the yard which was a result of soils and rubble being stored over the silt trap and interceptor that is installed on the site. However the site is in the process of building a storage bay for the inert materials and once these have moved the water will drain correctly. This work was completed days after the site inspection and confirmed with photos that were sent on 25/05/2022.

As part of your permit condition you must inspect, validate and maintain the engineered site containment and drainage systems to make sure they are fit for purpose.

There were numerous compressed gas bottles scattered around the site with no clear storage area. This was raised during the inspection and Mr Brown was advised to store them within a secure cage for fire safety reasons.

A selection of waste transfer notes were viewed with no issues identified.

There are 3 waste exemptions registered for Wrecsam Wrecycled Ltd which Brown's skips is also known as. Exemptions may not be used to top up or extend the operations of permitted sites. Activities conducted under exemptions must be conducted as a separate operation to those authorised by your permit. If the permit area or amounts of waste stored on site need to be increased a permit variation would need to be applied for.
