A review of all available technologies to reduce dangerous substance and metal levels within the discharge shall form part of the reduction programme. The below submission was received, in compliance with IC 19, via email on the 29th December 2017, as per the new agreed submission timeframe.

QP73- dangerous substances and heavy metals Identification programme

A review of the submission show it to be compliant with the requirements of IC19, aside from the submission of the detailed submission of a reduction programme. The reasoning is acceptable to the regulator given that as detailed in the QP73 submission:

2 – DANGEROUS SUBSTANCES AND HEAVY METAL REDUCTION

Presently it is not possible to provide a projection for the implementation of a reduction programme until the identification programme is underway. Due to the operation of the site Benchmarking against other treatment facilities will not provide any beneficial background, should this information be readily available. As discussed within this document should any problematic waste streams be identified during the work being carried out consideration will be given to the viability of these streams from a business perspective before including them in any pre-treatment or enhanced effluent treatment stages of the programme.

The comments supplied within the email submission are also noted *“During the work which I have carried out on the three IC’s to date it has become more apparent that due to the synergies between all of the IC’s I see that this is very much a ‘work in progress’. Obviously IC 18 and IC 19 are part of a continuous programme which will continue to operate. I hope that you can understand this from my perspective in that it is anticipated that it will be after the completion of phase 1 of the identification programme (IC19) until we have any tangible data.”*

As previously stated addendums to the IC could be submitted following completion of the identification programme (phase 1)

NRW accepts the IC 19 Submission.

Please note the acceptance of these documents does not in any way confer any approval on future developments at this facility.

These documents will now form part of the operating techniques of the permit and added to table S1.2 operating techniques. At the next permit variation, they will be incorporated into the permit formally.
