Permitted Activities

The site was found to be operating within the confines of the activities listed in the permit, although the activities have moved slightly and an up-to-date site plan was provided during the inspection. The main changes involve the recovery area having disappeared as this is not currently being undertaken, and the refrigerant transfer area and associated ISO tanks have been moved.

Such changes are very minor and do not have any impact on emissions, however, the Operator is advised to provide information to Natural Resources Wales regarding any changes at least 14 days prior to them taking place for agreement.

A running total of the quantity of waste stored on site is kept on the board in the lab. This was last updated on the 09/07/13 as 6.5 te and is thus well within permitted limits.

The Operator's queries with regard to the last variation (EPR/MP3531MD/V004) to the permit as a result of the Industrial Emissions Directive were quite rightly noted. It is recognised that the site is permitted for blending and mixing.

Storage, Labelling and Segregation

Drums are stored in labelled bays with their origin written on them. A further records of waste stored in bays is kept up to date on a board in the lab.

Waste Records

Records and transfer notes of waste accepted and leaving the site for incineration were reviewed together with the associated Environmental Management System and procedures. Despite good documentation and records being retained, a shortcoming with regard to permit compliance was noted. Condition 2.3.5 requires the Operator to provide the disposal facility with specific information prior to receipt. This includes the hazard classification associated with the waste and its composition. It is understood that a significant proportion of refrigerant gas sent for incineration contains hydrocarbons with flammable (H3) classification. However, this has not been provided formally to the disposal facility, nor is it stated on consignment notes. **Non-compliance C4 = CC3-** potential minor impact if already verbally communicated.

The Operator also undertakes analysis of the gas mixtures received and bulked up at the site from time to time. This information should be passed on to the disposal site.

The Operator is also advised to ensure it checks the permit of any new disposal site employed to ensure they are permitted to take the waste type, in this case 14 06 01*. It is advisable to retain documentation to demonstrate such checks for Duty of Care purposes.

Emergency Plans

Emergency plans and procedures were reviewed and deemed to be acceptable for the nature and scale of the operation, which essentially employs two people on the waste side. A DSEAR risk assessment has been produced for the site.

A further site inspection is planned for Q4.
