Hi Peter,

I've just tried calling your office but obviously you're not in today, so...

Just to clarify, on the outside face of the existing sheet piles we plan to fix a scaffold working platform to enable safe working for operatives who will be fixing, tightening and testing the new rock anchors.

As this scaffold will effectively overhang the mean spring tide mean level as defined in the **Marine and Coastal Access Act 2009** - *Construction, alteration or improvement works (including works hanging/suspended over the marine licensable area and works beneath the sea bed eg tunnels, bridges and piers)*, I'm guessing we need a marine licence for these works which will negate the need for a FRAP as well.

Also the Act defines our activities on site as Minor –

Minor construction and repairs

- **Scaffolding**/access towers to facilitate the maintenance of existing structures. Note - any licence or exemption requirements for the maintenance activity must also be considered.
- Minor maintenance including repairing, replacing or reasonably improving within the original design envelope, **bolts**, flaps, valves, cathodic protection, access covers, grills, joints, decking on a pier or pontoon, health and safety equipment or other ancillary equipment attached to existing structures. Note - This does not include fundamental alterations to the use of a structure. Repairs must be within the existing boundaries of the structure or assets being maintained.

And would therefore carry a fee for the marine licence of £600 per application, of which I will only require 1 I believe.

Could you please confirm that my understanding is correct and what fees will be applicable?

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Good afternoon Gary,

If works are on the landward side of the defence and therefore are not reached by mean high water spring tides then a marine licensing will not be required for those works.

I am unclear for your comment *There will be scaffolding on the overhang of the already installed*. Has this work already taken place? And it is also unclear whether this works is seaward of Mean High Water Springs, if so a marine licence may be required for the temporary deposit of scaffolding.

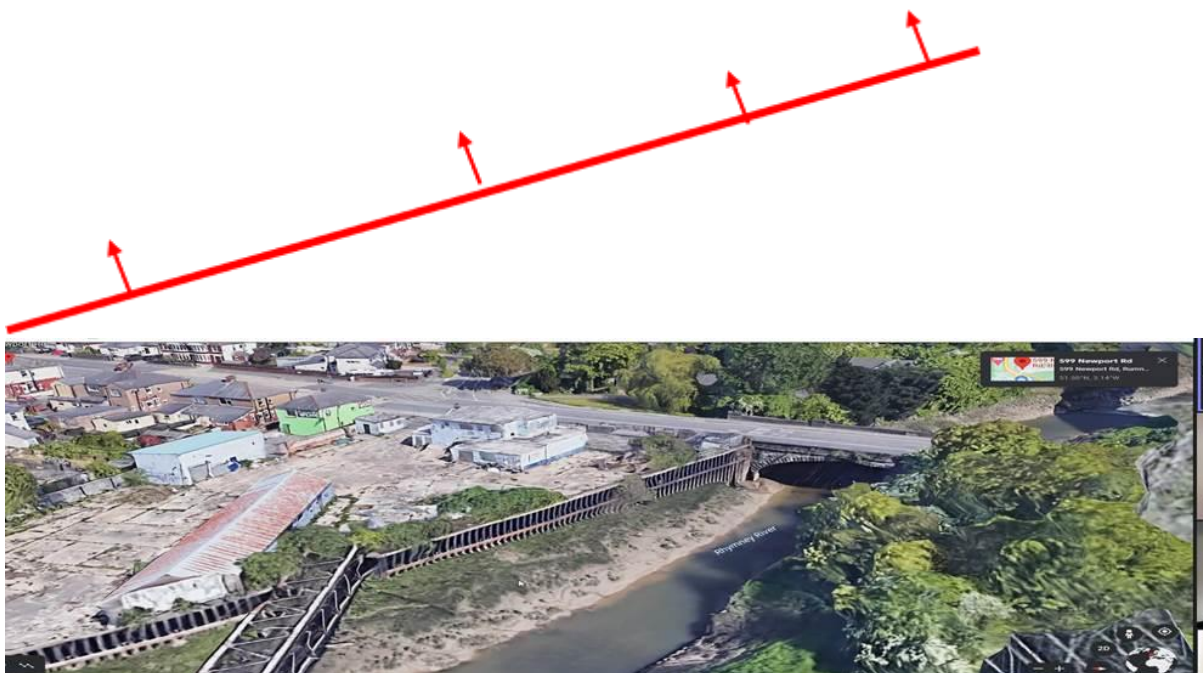

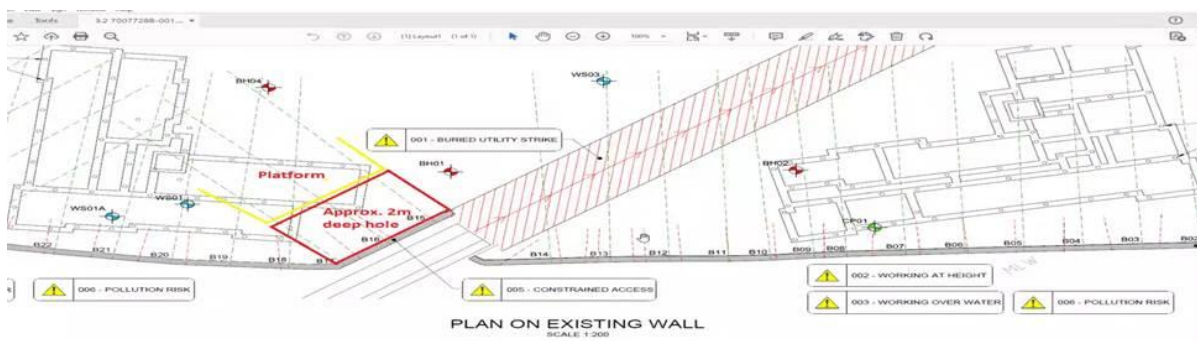

Good morning Neil,

Apologies for a delay in response. Please can you confirm whether all works including any temporary works or deposit are set to occur on the watercourse. From the method it appears that works are taking place on the landward side of the existing structure.

As detailed on our [website](#) a marine licence is required for any works that are seaward of Mean High Water Springs. Therefore works landward of the defence are unlikely to require a marine licence unless the defence has breached, or is to be removed as part of the works. Works to the seaward of the defence or on the seaward side of the defence are likely to require a marine licence.
