**Issue of Natural Resources Wales initiated variation of your permit**

We've decided to vary your permit following the publication of the revised Best Available Techniques (BAT) Reference Document (BREF) for Waste Incineration. We're satisfied that you can continue to carry out your activities in accordance with the variation, without harm to the environment or human health. **This means that all requirements specified in the permit need to be met on or prior to the specified dates. For improvement conditions, you shall make all necessary arrangements to meet the specified requirements on or before the specified dates. For all permit requirements which are changing from 3 December 2023 you shall make all necessary arrangements to either meet all of these standards before that date or cease permitted operations before that date (See separate letter regarding monitoring requirements).**

I enclose a notice showing the changes to your permit. Please keep this in a safe place with your other permit records.

### Medium Combustion Plant Directive

We have not implemented any requirements of the Medium Combustion Plant Directive for any plant considered existing Medium Combustion Plant (MCP) (first put into operation prior to 20 December 2018). If you have existing MCP you will need to make an application to vary your permit and have it in place by:

- 1 January 2024 if it's an existing MCP and the capacity is between 5MWth and 50MWth
- 1 January 2029 if it's an existing MCP and the capacity is between 1MWth and less than 5MWth

You must comply with your MCPD permit by:

- 1 January 2025 if it's an existing MCP and the capacity is between 5MWth and 50MWth
- 1 January 2030 if it's an existing MCP and the capacity is between 1MWth and less than 5MWth

### Rights of appeal

If you are not happy with any permit condition that has been imposed by the variation you may appeal to the Welsh Ministers. If you want to appeal any condition imposed as a result of your application you must make your appeal no later than six months from the date of the variation notice. If you want to appeal any condition we've added as an Natural Resources Wales initiated variation you must make your appeal no later than two months from the date of the notice.

The documents are:

- a statement of the grounds of appeal;
- a copy of any relevant application;
- a copy of any relevant environmental permit;
- a copy of any relevant correspondence between the appellant and the regulator;
- a copy of any decision or notice which is the subject matter of the appeal; and
- a statement indicating whether you wish the appeal to be in the form of a hearing or dealt with by way of written representations.

You may withdraw an appeal by notifying the Welsh Ministers in writing and sending a copy of that notification to us.

Following the UK's departure from the EU on 31 January 2020 and the end of the transition period on 31 December 2020, the legal obligations relating to compliance with environmental permits and legislation will continue to apply. NRW will continue to issue and regulate all permits and licenses in line with our current practice.
