### 4. Details of our assessment

Site Inspection report 3<sup>rd</sup> Oct 2022

This was a routine inspection carried out by NRW and covered the basic outline of the current site permit.

Present; George Ausgood (Infinis), Geraint Harris (NRW), Richard Taylor (NRW site inspector)

Permit conditions

1.2 Site – The permitted area was complied with and matched the current permit.

1.3- Management system – The site comes under a general group wide management system which is further specialised to Individual sites.

1.4 – Improvement condition – There are no outstanding conditions.

1.5 - Minor operational changes – A single Jenbacher gas engine was operating at the time. Site currently hold 2 keeping one in reserve.

1.6 - Current status – Input approx. 40% CH4 content

Engine Producing ~850kW

Approx. 1% Oxygen

Site is producing roughly 5-6kW per month. As the gas field yield dies off the gas engines will need to be changed for smaller capacity units. Threshold values for triggering this are capacities <1kW reached in approximately 10 years.

Pics 1 and 2. Jenbacher gas engine and Flare stack at Infinis Lamby Way.



1.7 Emissions to Water / sewer – none seen at this inspection. No emissions are permitted.

1.8 Emissions to Groundwater – area clear of emissions. No staining or residues witnessed.

1.9 Odour – mild landfill odour was present in the site compound, but not external to it. Site have not received complaints from external sources.

2.0 Management – Site representatives are experts in their field with considerable experience and training in place.

2.1 Maintenance appeared to be good. Infinis staff carry out maintenance and repairs as standard practice.

2.2 Site closure plan – site is reminded of the need to maintain a site closure plan as laid down in permit condition 2.11.1.3 so that site can be decommissioned whilst minimising the risks of pollution.

2.3 Site relations with neighbouring Landfill operator permit JP3239SP – commercial agreements are now in place. Previous issues with both sites have now been resolved

2.4 Reporting emissions

Site are required to report annually. Average emission figures for the gas engines were below the permit limit.

The flare stack was measured. This occurs when the flare runs for over 10% of the time available. Infinis used an MCERT's independent company to carry out the monitoring. The readings were within the permitted parameters.

2.5 Site condition – No excess waste, pests, vermin, or ground staining was seen at the time of the inspection. No excess odour, noise or vibration was observed.
