4. Details of our assessment

This site was visited on the 22nd of November 2022 as part of a group of four sites on the Afon Ogwen. The Afon Ogwen drains down into the Menai Straits which is a designated shellfish water. The intention of the visit was to see the site, to ensure its compliant with its

permit, and if possible, to reduce the frequency of storm discharges and hence the bacterial loading onto the shellfish beds.

The weather on the day of the visit was dry and sunny. There had been rain the previous night and November had been a wet month.

At the time of the visit, the storm tanks were full and were discharging to the Afon Ogwen.

A minor leak to ground was noted from one of the storm tanks. Please see the attached photograph. It was explained during the visit that the tanks had been re-sealed at considerable cost approximately one year before. It was further explained that Dwr Cymru were in discussion with the company that had done the work, to get the tank re-sealed, but that the company were resisting. Please get the tank re-sealed.

An inspection of the outfall to the river showed that the end of the pipe was into a bay just short of the main body of the river. It was noted that there was trace amounts of sewage fungus present in this bay, which wasn't surprising as the storm tanks were discharging. Given that there have been complaints about sewage fungus in this bay previously, it would be wise for Dwr Cymru to consider extending the pipe into the main body of the river.

From the Rivers Trust website it could be seen that the storm tanks had spilt 140 times during 2021 for a total of 2750 hours. Is this correct and is the data accurate? Please confirm whether any action is planned in the catchment to reduce this spill rate, or not.
