Dear Mr. Kemp,

In accordance with Cabot Barry Site Environmental Permit, please find below our formal response as required by Permit Condition (PC) 2.11.2 (Permit number: BU2110IS). Permit Condition 2.11.2 states:

'Notwithstanding condition 2.11.1 of Cabot's Permit, the Operator shall carry out a full review of the Site Closure Plan at least every 4 years.'

The Site Closure Plan that was first submitted to the Agency in November 2006 has been reviewed. The review covered all sections in the Site Closure Plan:

- 1. Introduction**
- 2. Design Build and Operation Considerations**
- 3. Plant Decommissioning**
- 4. Plant Demolition**
- 5. Site Condition**
- 6. Commitment**
- 7. Examples of Considerations**

The review concluded that the methodology and techniques identified in the 2006 Site Closure Plan remain applicable and there was no requirement as such to amend the current Plan. Cabot Barry does not have a formal plan for closure in place for the decommissioning of the Barry installation due to the anticipated life of the installation. The development of a formal closure plan is not considered necessary at this stage however, a formal Closure Plan will be produced when installation closure becomes a foreseeable event. The plan will outline the measures that will be taken to prevent pollution of the environment and ensure installation clean up to a satisfactory state agreed with the appropriate local and regulatory bodies. Cabot remains committed full compliance with all UK environmental legislation during the lifetime of its Environmental Permit up to and including site closure.
