4. Details of our assessment

This report details the site visit made on the 18th of January 2023 to Full Moon Waste Transfer and the HWRC (Household Waste Recycling Centre), Permit number EPR- WP3490VW Officer Carla CURTIS was accompanied by Scott JONES – Waste Treatment and Disposal Supervisor and Ricky VAUGHN – Waste Management Officer. The weather conditions were cold and sunny it and it had snowed in the early hours, but the site was well gritted and clear at the time of visit.

To remind the company following each visit Natural Resources Wales will produce a Compliance Assessment Report (CAR) detailing our comments from the inspection. If we substantiate reasonably foreseeable risks or actual impact to the environment, we can breach the business against your permit conditions which can affect your site banding annual subsistence fees; this is scored on a Category 1 - 4 basis:

- 1 - Major, serious persistent and/or extensive impact on the environment/people/property
- 2 - Significant impact or effect on the environment/people/property
- 3 - Minor impact or effect on the environment/people/property
- 4 - A non-compliance which has no potential environmental effect

GENERAL OBSERVATIONS - The site was fully operational with limited traffic through the HWRC, the transfer station was fairly busy at the time of the visit with the waste being distributed to other companies / sites within the UK. No waste of any type was stored outside of the permit boundary at the time of the visit. There were no apparent issues with site infrastructure, this has been recently improved with new road markings to control speed and direction of traffic.

WASTE ACTIVITIES - All the waste storage containers were all clearly marked, and signage was in place to inform members of the public what each bin was for.

DRAINAGE SYSTEM - The drainage is working efficiently and is regularly maintained. The drainage channels are cleaned around four times a year.

SITE SECURITY - The site has recently benefited from funding for site infrastructure improvements which have included a new welfare cabin, secure storage containers, updated CCTV and Fencing enhancements.

TECHNICAL COMPETENCY The site TCM is Scott Jones. The latest WAMITAB certificate we have on the system for Scott expires 25/02/24.

WASTE RETURN SUBMISSIONS These appear to be up to date and correct, the total quantity of

waste accepted at this site must not exceed 74,999 tonnes per year. Based on the submitted waste return data for 2022, the total was accepted was 52,589 tonnes which is within the sites annual threshold. NRW officer Carla CURTIS left site at around 10:40.

On site Scott pointed out there was a problem with the Vermin control system which helps to deter the seagulls, the wire had been severed due to some maintenance work being carried out. (See image 2 below showing seagulls)

Action Only please ensure the vermin control system is repaired to ensure compliance with your environmental permit.
