4. Details of our assessment

Maxibrite Limited

Permit Reference: VP3132LJ

The purpose of this Compliance Assessment Report (CAR) is to record Natural Resources Wales' (hereafter NRW) assessment against Maxibrite Limited (hereafter Maxibrite) Air and Water monitoring returns for Q1, Q2, Q3 and Q4 and their annual reporting to NRW.

NRW received all of the quarterly returns from Maxibrite on time throughout the year.

Emission Monitoring

Air Emissions

The following results are for the A9 Particulate Matter parameter with the Emission Limit Value (ELV) of 45mg/m³

Q1 – 0.37mg/m³

Q2 – 0.32mg/m³

Q3 – 0.32mg/m³

Q4 – The dryer was not used in Quarter 4 of 2022

All results were well within the ELV and therefore complaint.

Annual Reporting

Performance 1

Total Raw Material used was 1.015tonnes. There is negligible change from the previous year.

Energy Usage

The site used 951.96MWh of Electricity and 446.50MWh of Natural Gas (converted to Primary Energy) in the year 2022. This equates to 0.0073MWh/tonne of the total energy used on site in 2022.

Water usage

The sites used a total of 32,429m³ of water in 2021. Of this, 1,887m³ was from the mains and 30,542m³ was abstracted. There was an increase in the amount of water used from the mains but a decrease in the abstraction. This is an overall reduction in the use of water on site.

Site Review

The site produced a total 19,026.4tonnes of briquettes in the year 2021. Air Emissions have also decreased due to the site now only using the rotary drier and only emitting particulate matter.

The site has made an improvement on the on-site water recycling process where more water is caught on site and held to mitigate against dust. At the same time due to drier months during summer no discharges were made to the brook in July and August preventing impact to the brook.
