Any non-compliance we have identified and recorded on this form is an offence. It can result in criminal prosecution and/or suspension or revocation of your permit.

4. Details of our assessment

This Compliance Assessment Report (CAR) follows the review of the 2022 annual monitoring and returns data.

This data was submitted to Natural Resources Wales (NRW) on 31/01/23, which is within the timescales specified in the permit.

Annual emissions testing (total particulate matter) was carried out on the following emission points A12,A14,A15 and A16 by an MCERTS accredited third-party test house between 01/12/22 and 02/12/22. Emission points A12,A15 and A16 recorded values of 1.01 mg/m³, 7.0mg/m³ and 2.5 mg/m³ respectively. This is below the permitted Emission Limit Value (ELV) of 20 mg/m³.

Emission point A14 recorded a value of 125mg/m³, which is above the ELV of 20mg/m³. Natural Resources Wales (NRW) considers this a breach of permit condition 3.1.2 and a category 3 score has been applied (E1-Emissions-Air-CCS3).

The emissions test report was received by the operator on 14/12/22 and they notified NRW of this breach by submitting a schedule 5 notification (parts a and b) on 14/12/22. They carried out an investigation into the breach of ELV and stated measures to be taken to resolve the issue (thorough clean of stack and reduce fan power).

On 22/12/22, emission point A14 was retested by an MCERTS accredited third-party test house and recorded a value of 1.3mg/m³ vs an ELV of 20 mg/m³ for total particulate matter.

Action 1- Following the breach, the operator implemented the measures stated in the schedule 5 notification and re-tested emission point A14. The results from the re-test were in compliance with the permitted ELV. No further action to be taken at this stage.

With reference to form E1, energy use in 2022 (22598.65 MWh) was higher than 2021 (18179.2 MWh) but CO₂ produced in 2022 (3753.64 tonnes) was lower than 2021 (3855.96 tonnes).

With reference to form WU1, water use in 2022 (21520 m³) was less than 2021 (22974m³).

With reference to form R1, waste produced in 2022 (205.1 tonnes) was less than waste produced in 2021 (213.1 tonnes).

With reference to form PI1, animal feed production in 2022 (319,017 tonnes) was lower than 2021 (320,734 tonnes).
