4. Details of our assessment

A site visit was carried out on the 03/03/23 of the abstraction that takes place from the Horseshoe falls (point A) under licence 24/67/5/0057.

The reason for the visit was to check compliance with the fish screen condition:

9.5 Point A:

For the period 1 March to 12 April in each year: No abstraction shall take place unless six flat panel screens with 4 millimetre mesh are installed to prevent the entrapment, entrainment or impingement of lamprey at the point of abstraction in accordance with the plans and specifications to be submitted and approved in writing by NRW.

The screens were found to be in place but a number of these were sitting higher in the frame than others. It wasn't possible to see if there were any gaps under the screens that would allow fish to pass through into the abstraction. I would ask that the seating of the screens is looked into to ensure the inflow to the abstraction is fully screened as this is required to ensure fish are prevented from entering the abstraction.

Air blowers were operating periodically during the visit. This could be seen to clear the screens and prevent them from blocking. A low flow across the weir could be seen to carry the vegetation away from the screen after being cleared by the blowers.

No visit was carried out to the pump house at Pont Cysyllte (point B). The local Environment Team for this area (Wrexham and Flintshire) have been made aware that the Canal and Rivers Trust are planning to carry out maintenance work on the aqueduct in the future, that will require this being closed off and drawn down.

Please ensure you are compliant with the following screening condition before an abstraction takes place at this point.

9.7 (i) Point B:

Prior to abstraction taking place, under this licence, the Licence Holder shall install screening to prevent the entrapment, entrainment or impingement of lamprey and salmon, at the point of abstraction, in accordance with the plans and specifications to be submitted and approved in writing by NRW.
