4. Details of our assessment

On Monday the 27th of February 2023 Natural Resources officers attended the site to conduct an unannounced site inspection.

The site was last visited on the 18th of March 2022. Compliance Assessment Report NRW0039705 refers.

The officers met with Nicky James, site owner, who accompanied them throughout the inspection.

The site was generally well run and tidy. Officers noticed that a new, lockable cage was now being used to store flammable pressurised gas containers.

Storage

Officers saw a fire extinguisher amongst other waste next to a skip. Officers were told that the waste had arrived on site earlier on that day and was being sorted by a staff member who was seen working at the yard.

Please ensure all pressurised gas containers are stored in the cage as soon as practicable.

Officers also witnessed batteries stored outdoors without appropriate, weatherproof container. Please see photo below.

Action: Please remove all batteries and store indoors in a leakproof container. For immediate compliance.



Waste Return Review:

A review of the waste returns submissions for permit EPR-NP3997EE - Q1-Q4 2021 and Q1-Q4 2022 has been completed.

Permit conditions I: 1:2 of your permit specifies that a summary of the information, including nil returns shall be submitted for each quarter of the financial year and shall be submitted within one month of the end of each quarter.

Natural Resources Wales has not received any waste returns data for Q1-Q4 2021 and Q1-Q4 2022. This has subsequently been scored as a C4 breach against the relevant permit condition. Action Required: The missing quarterly returns for 2021 and 2022 must be submitted to **waste.returns@cyfoethnatriolcymru.gov.uk** no later than 28th of April 2023.

Please note that Q1 2023 is due to be submitted by the 30th of April 2023.
