Spreading on own land – manure and slurry nutrient analysis – Where manure and slurry is spread on own land, they must be analysed to provide information for nutrient management planning. Records should show that analysis is carried out twice yearly, or once per production cycle where that cycle exceeds six months. The analysis should include available nitrogen, total nitrogen, available phosphorus, and total phosphorus. *Please provide the report to NRW by the 30th June 2023.*

Site Closure Plan

Please construct a Site Closure Plan and send document to NRW by the 16th June 2023.

The aim of the Site Closure Plan is to ensure that the site can be decommissioned to avoid any pollution risk and return the site to satisfactory state. The plan should include instruction on how to store/dispose materials on site e.g. litter, gas, diesel, services, waste materials, feed, cleaning operations, intension for housing etc. The plan should be reviewed and maintained to ensure that it takes account of pollution risks that may arise due to changes in site operations.

Odour and Noise Management Plan – Please produce an Odour and Noise Management Plan. *Please email a copy of both to NRW, this action must be completed by the 30th June 2023.*
