Any non-compliance we have identified and recorded on this form is an offence. It can result in criminal prosecution and/or suspension or revocation of your permit.

At this time, we do not intend to take any further action.

4. Details of our assessment

On the 12th of June 2023, Natural Resources Wales received information including two photographs showing pollution of a stream. It was alleged that these photos were of the stream next to the Youth Hostel at Pen y Pass, however the date and location of these photos could not be verified.

After contacting Mathew Teasdale and Danial Roberts of the YHA, it's understood that

there has been a fault in the treatment plant serving the youth hostel. It's understood that the plant has since been desludged and was to be serviced.

In light of the complaint, please provide Natural Resources Wales with an emissions management plan as per condition 3.2.2 of the permit. The condition states:

"3.2.2. The operator shall:

- (a) if notified by the Environment Agency that the activities are giving rise to pollution, submit to the Environment Agency for approval within the period specified; an emissions management plan;
- (b) implement the approved emissions management plan from the date of approval, unless otherwise agreed in writing by the Environment Agency."

(Note: Natural Resources Wales is the legal body in Wales that replaced Environment Agency Wales, Countryside Council for Wales and the Forestry Commission in Wales).

The plan should explain what the problem is with the treatment plant, what action is needed to bring it back into compliance, what timescale is needed for this and what the current effluent quality is like.

Please note that this Compliance Assessment Report will go on our public register.

Should we receive further pollution complaints, Natural Resources Wales may attend the site and charge for attendance time.

We intend to add the site to our routine compliance monitoring programme to ensure that the site complies with the permit conditions. Should any non-compliances come to light, appropriate enforcement will follow.
