3. What will happen next?

4. Details of our assessment

Q2 2023 (April - June) monitoring results were submitted to NRW on 21 July 2023 in accordance with Condition 4.2.2

Q2 Monitoring Returns

S4.1 Leachate Levels (Condition 2.9.1)

(permitted limit 1m above base of cell)

The reported leachate levels for Q2 were below the permitted limit.

S4.2 Groundwater Monitoring Data (3 point moving average)

The current permit has set limits for Ammoniacal Nitrogen (NH₃), Zinc (Zn) and Nickel (Ni) on boreholes 1,2,9 and 10 only. The 3 point moving average breaches of the trigger levels (limits) are as follows:

Zn concentrations exceeding the limits (BH1, BH9 & BH10 0.04mg/l & BH2 1.95mg/l)

- BH1 (0.07mg/l)
- BH9 (0.07mg/l)
- BH10 (0.09mg/l)

The above are in breach of Condition 3.1.2 and has been scored a C3.

Ni concentrations exceeding the limit (0.01mg/l)

- BH9 (0.02mg/l)

The above is in breach of Condition 3.1.2 and has been scored a C3.

S4.3 External Gas Monitoring Wells (Condition 3.1)

The current permit has set permitted limits, Methane (CH₄) 1% v/v and Carbon Dioxide (CO₂) 1.5% v/v for BH1, 2, 8, 9 and 10.

The reported external gas monitoring concentrations for Q2 were below the permitted limits, except for BH8 in which was CH₄ was recorded at 2.6% in June 2023.

The above is in breach of Condition 3.1 and has been scored a C3.

Waste Received Q2

Waste Received into landfill was 16.04 tonnes of general site waste and inert Construction Waste. No waste removed.

Schedule 6 Report

Schedule 6 Notifications were submitted on 12 and 21 June 2023 in response to breaches of ELVs for Zinc, Nickel, Carbon Dioxide and Methane. Ongoing justifications and mitigation proposals for breaches are being investigated. Measures taken or intended to be taken are, continued monitoring and evaluation of groundwater breaches and Operator to apply for a permit variation to amend limits.

Actions to be Undertaken by the Operator

- Actions in the previous CARs required the Operator to investigate and report the reasons for continued leachate level breaches. The Operator provided a root cause analysis of the leachate breaches and summarised initial proposals to mitigate against future breaches on 31 May 2023. NRW responded requesting clarification and further detail on 9 June 2023. **ACTION: Operator to respond to NRW with the required information by 31 August 2023.**
- An action in the previous CAR was to submit a permit variation application by 30 June 2023. NRW has not received an application to date. The purpose of the permit application is to provide information to support a request to agree new limits. **ACTION: Operator to provide confirmation of the proposed timescales for submission of the permit variation application and associated documents by 1 August 2023.**
- **ACTION: Inform NRW of all permit breaches in accordance with Condition 4.3 and within the timescales required within the Schedule 6 Notification template.**
