4. Details of our assessment

This Compliance Assessment Report follows an unannounced site inspection undertaken on 1 August 2023 between 12:55 and 13:30. The Production Manager accompanied Officers around site. The inspection was undertaken during the shift changeover.

The permit for the site has been varied and a new consolidated permit was issued on 15 June 2023. As part of this the Operator submitted updated operating techniques, this included a loading bay extension that would house the carcass trailer. In order to facilitate the building of the loading bay the temporary inflatable structure had to be moved, this was completed the week commencing 17 July 2023. Prior to the building works starting a temporary tunnel is to be created to transport the dolavs of carcasses direct to the trailer within the inflatable building.

Action: Provide an update to NRW as to when the construction of the loading bay is to commence and the anticipated build time.

Trailers in the despatch bay were checked and were all powered by electric hook up. This was confirmed as one of the trailers was switched to diesel as it appeared to be louder than the others. The Operator was reminded that if older and noisier trailers came to site it would be beneficial for these to be parked away from the boundary with Church View.

The site was generally clean and tidy. However, it was noted that by the packing area near to the stores there were some bones that looked to have recently been discarded. These were cleared away immediately. It was unclear how these bones had arrived in the area. The Operator was reminded that this area should be included as part of the regular daily site inspections.

Advice and Guidance: Ensure that stores personnel are checking the packing area regularly, including at the beginning and end of any shifts. Any residual chicken pieces / offal should be cleared away promptly to avoid attracting pests to the site.

A CAT2 trailer observed at the rear of the site had reportedly just finished being loaded. Officers observed the trailer being sheeted to ensure this occurred prior to any transfer of the trailer within the site and any subsequent removal off site.

No significant odour was detected on site during the visit. No odour was detected offsite either prior to or after the site inspection.
