**ENFORCEMENT NOTICE TO TAKE SPECIFIED STEPS IN RELATION TO A
BREACH OF PERMIT CONDITIONS**

Natural Resources Wales considers that the following conditions of the environmental permit conditions are being contravened:

- 1) Condition 1.1.4 (Table 1.1) Maximum storage capacity of the site shall not exceed that which can be contained within skips and bays constructed in accordance with conditions in section 2.1 (Engineering site containment and drainage systems). Section 2.1 includes permit conditions 2.1.1, 2.1.2 (Provision and maintenance of site containment and drainage systems), Table 2.1 (Site containment and drainage standards), 2.1.3, 2.1.4 (Construction quality assurance of new / existing site containment and drainage systems) and 2.1.5.**

BECAUSE

The site is exceeding the waste storage capacity of skips and bays, in that the bays and skips are no longer visible across most of the site because waste is covering them. The waste is piled high, which has merged together as one continual mass, covering most of the permitted area behind the trommel. The waste is estimated to be over 6 metres high in some areas. The first CAR form (CAR_NRW0042138) issued following a site inspection on 10/07/2023, required the site to remove excess waste from site, so that waste was only stored within the capacity of skips and bays. A further site inspection on 16/08/2023, found that the site is still exceeding waste storage limits, having not complied with the requirements of CAR_NRW0042138 .

You are required to take the steps set out in **Schedule 1** by the dates specified in order to remedy the contraventions.

General

Appeal provisions

You are entitled to appeal against this notice under Regulation 31(1)(f) of the Environmental Permitting (England and Wales) Regulations 2016. Notice of appeal must be made within two months of the date of this notice. An appeal does not affect the requirements of this notice.

The required documents are:

- A statement of the grounds of appeal
- A copy of any relevant application
- A copy of any relevant environmental permit
- A copy of any relevant correspondence between the appellant and the regulator
- A copy of any decision or notice which is the subject matter of the appeal
- A statement indicating whether you wish the appeal to be in the form of a hearing or dealt with by way of written representations.

You may withdraw an appeal by notifying The Planning Inspectorate in writing and sending a copy of that notification to Natural Resources Wales. Further information about making an appeal and the forms that you will need are available from The Planning Inspectorate detailed above.

Legislation note

In this document "Natural Resources Wales" means the Natural Resources Body for Wales established by Article 3 of the Natural Resources Body for Wales (Establishment) Order 2012. On 01 April 2013 the Natural Resources Body for Wales (Functions) Order 2013 transferred the relevant functions of the Countryside Council for Wales, and functions of the Environment Agency and the Forestry Commission in Wales to the Natural Resources Body for Wales.
