4. Details of our assessment

This Compliance Assessment Report is being generated following a pollution complaint about this site that was self reported by Dwr Cymru. This incident was recorded on WIRS as incident number 2308783.

It is understood from information provided by Dwr Cymru that there was a blockage within the pumping station which led to sewage overflowing down the bank and into the adjoining watercourse.

Photographs were supplied which showed that there was sewage fungus in the watercourse as well as higher ammonia downstream compared to upstream. Based on this evidence the incident was classified as a low level impact to water and a warning is issued via this CAR form.

The incident is classed as a permit breach as sewage from the site discharged into the adjoining watercourse rather than at the permitted discharge point for storm and emergency discharges.

Please explain what happened and what actions you will take to prevent a re-occurrence.

It should be noted that sewage fungus takes a couple of days to develop. So when was the pumping station last visited? Is there a deficiency in maintenance? Were no alarms triggered by the incident? Your comments on these fronts would be appreciated.
