4. Details of our assessment

This Compliance Assessment Report (CAR) has been issued in response to the submission of the annual monitoring returns 2023 (1 January - 31 December) by Dunbia (UK) (*the operator*) for activities at Teify Park Abattoir and Meat Processing Plant, Lampeter Road, Llanybydder SA40 9QE under permit EPR-BV9683IH.

This compliance assessment was undertaken on 6 February 2024. However, to ensure that the CCS score is attributed to the correct financial year (for billing) the date on the CARS has been altered to 31 December 2023.

Annual Monitoring Returns 2023

Permit condition 4.2.2 requires the operator to:

“For the following activities referenced in schedule 1, table S1.1 (A1 to A4) A report or reports on the performance of the activities over the previous year shall be submitted to Natural Resources Wales by 31 January (or other date agreed in writing by Natural Resources Wales) each year. The report(s) shall include as a minimum:

- a. a review of the results of the monitoring and assessment carried out in accordance with the permit including an interpretive review of that data;*
- b. the annual production /treatment data set out in schedule 4 table S4.2; and*
- c. the performance parameters set out in schedule 4 table S4.3 using the forms specified in table S4.4 of that schedule.”*

The following documents were submitted to NRW by the operator for the annual return submissions:

- Energy 1 - Reporting of Energy Usage for 2023
- Sewer 1 - Reporting of Emissions to Sewer
- Water Usage 2 - Reporting of Water Usage for 2023
- Performance 1 - Reporting of Other Performance Indicators

It is noted that emissions to water and Form 4.2.5 quarterly waste effluent inputs to ETP were not submitted with this reporting as they are submitted on a quarterly frequency as required by permit conditions.

Annual Performance Report 2023

This shows a significant increase in carcase sale tonnages from 4,544.75 in 2022 to 12,517.47 in 2023. This as a result in the change of activities on site with regard to the addition of the beef line, which has increased the site's production capacity and the overall increased total production.

This has had a knock-on effect on water consumption requiring more water for washdowns, for instance. However, also noting that the water usage per tonne of production has decreased in 2023 compared to 2022 due to improved practices reducing resource wastage in addition to beef line changes.

Total effluent discharged has increased in 2023 compared to 2022 due to operational changes including the implementation of the beef line increasing water usage.

There has been an increase in overall total energy consumption in 2023 in comparison to 2022 due to operational changes on site and increased total production.

There has been an increase in hazardous and non-hazardous wastes removed in 2023 compared to 2022 due to an increase of production in 2023 in comparison to 2022.

- The monitoring returns for 2023 (1 January - 31 December) were submitted on 31 January 2024. This data was sent within the reporting period, which is **compliant** with permit condition 4.2.2.
- The monitoring return submissions for Q1, Q2, Q3, and Q4 in 2023 were made inside the respective reporting windows, which is **compliant** with the environmental permit.
- The monitoring returns submitted include reporting of monitoring carried out in respect of the parameters and emission points specified in table S4.1 and S4.3 of schedule 4, which is **compliant** with the environmental permit.
- The monitoring returns submitted are for the reporting periods specified in table S4.1 of schedule 4, which is **compliant** with the environmental permit.
- The monitoring returns have been submitted using the forms specified in table S4.4 of schedule 4, which is **compliant** with the environmental permit.
- The monitoring returns submitted include results and assessments as required by the forms specified in table S4.4 of schedule 4, which is **compliant** with the environmental permit.

Based on the reports submitted by the operator, all emissions at the monitoring points and permitted parameters appear **compliant** with the specified emission limits.
