4. Details of our assessment

This report details the site visit made on the 24th January 2024 to A1 Skips, Newport, permit reference number EPR-FP3295FN.

Natural Resources Wales (NRW) Officer Greg GARDNER attended the A1 Skips site at Alexandra Docks, West Way Road, Newport, NP20 2UW for a routine site inspection at 11:00am where we met with the Site Consultant, Mr. Lee COVELL and Site Owner, Mr. Michael RANDALL. The weather was dry, and reasonably mild which it had also been the previous day.

GENERAL OBSERVATIONS

The site was operational at the time of the site inspection with small amounts of waste(s) present on site. During the site inspection, NRW Officer Greg GARDNER was introduced to Mr. Michael RANDALL who had recently purchased A1 Waste Management and is now the owner of the business. Infrastructure improvements are planned, as well as ongoing, at the site and were witnessed by NRW Officer GARDNER at the time of the inspection. Due to the change in ownership, a permit transfer would be required to amend details such as the registered office address as well as any potential changes to the sites operation. SITE INFRASTRUCTURE

The general housekeeping on the site was in good condition with no major amounts of loose debris located on the floor (as seen in photo 1). The flooring infrastructure was generally of good condition with newer areas currently being created as well as plans in place to improve other flooring areas in the near future (as seen in photo 2).

The size of waste stockpiles on site were within compliance of the sites Fire Prevention and Mitigation Plan (FPMP) with no issues identified (as seen in photo 3). Further infrastructure works are being undertaken with regards to the waste shed as well as the introduction of a picking line to improve the sites overall operational condition.

Drainage on site is via an interceptor which was operational at the time of the inspection and cleaned periodically.
