4. Details of our assessment

Cabot environmental objectives Permit Condition 4.1.5 – EMS update

Cabot submitted an environmental management system update to NRW on the 31.01.2024.

In December 2023 the site had a surveillance audit of their Environmental management system to check their continued compliance with the ISO14001:2015 standard. No non-conformances were reported.

Cabot has a continuous focus on reducing off quality production and 2023 saw a record low volume of off quality production with 20MT produced, equating to 0.23% of the annual production volume. Cabot also achieved a 50% reduction in waste to landfill in 2023

Cabot Corporate Sustainability Goals

Energy Intensity. Cabot continue to look for opportunities to reduce their energy intensity, but limited progress was made in 2023.

Community Engagement. Cabot continue to support several charities and causes and have initiated a strategic partnership with a local school.

Diversity and Inclusion. Cabots WIM-IN Employee Resource Group (ERG) was submitted for consideration to the Cabot Award for Excellence programme in 2023 for their work on diversity, Equity, and Inclusion. The WIM-IN group took a lead role in delivering the after-school club in conjunction with our community engagement team.

Cabot Site Closure and Decommissioning

Permit condition 2.1.1 – Notwithstanding condition 2.11.1 of Cabot's Permit, the Operator shall carry out a full review of the Site Closure Plan at least every 4 years.

In 2022 Cabot have reviewed the 2019 closure plan and concluded that the plan remains applicable. NRW confirms that the 2019 plan complies with the permit regulations and that the closure plan will be reviewed again in 2026

Quarterly Reports and Annual Emissions Monitoring

Cabot submitted the Q1, Q2, Q3, Q4 and annual monitoring reports within the required time frames.

Emissions to air of Chlorine, Chloromethanes, Hydrogen Chloride and Carbon Monoxide from emission point A1 are all compliant with the permit limits.

Emissions to to water at emissions points W1, W2 and W3 are all compliant with the permit.

Waste, Water and Energy Use 2023

Cabot had a total waste of 89.7 tonnes in 2023 which is significantly lower than previous years.

Water usage in 2023 was 124,004 m³.

Energy usage and CO2 production increased from 2022 but are lower than levels recorded from 2011 to 2021.

Chlorosilane and Hydrogen usage,

Hydrogen and Chlorosilane usage have remained consistent with previous years.

Carbon monoxide and waste silica

The Carbon monoxide figure has risen to its highest level since 2012.

The waste silica figure rose significantly in 2022 but has dropped in 2023 to a level consistent with 2021.
