NRW has received an updated response from Yuasa (provided by Environmental Visage) in respect of Improvement Condition IC 1, this was requested in CAR_NRW 0034966.

The report provides detailed comment in respect of Outstanding Items and an Amended Item. Comment in respect of each of these is detailed below;

BC006

We have considered the response in detail against the BAT requirements and in respect of the BAT 13 requirements are unable to accept the argument that the combustion units that do not have low NOx burners are outside the scope of the BREF. The reason for this is that they are associated processing equipment to the main pyrometallurgical process and NRW's interpretation is that on this basis they do fall under the requirements of BAT 13. In particular the comment below is taken from Scope section of the BREF;

In addition to basic manufacturing activities, this document covers the associated activities which could have an effect on emissions or pollution. Thus, this document includes activities from the preparation of raw materials to the dispatch of the finished products.

The main operations covered are:

- raw materials storage and preparation;
- fuels storage and preparation;
- the production processes, i.e. the pyrometallurgical and hydrometallurgical processes;
- emission prevention and reduction techniques;
- products, storage and preparation.

However, NRW are prepared to adopt a pragmatic approach, as there would clearly not be justification for replacement of burners that remain functional and where direct replacements are not readily available, solely to improve NOx performance. Also, the total NOx releases from such burners are unlikely in their own right to be of environmental significance.

Our position is therefore that the general approach is accepted but not the reasoning. On this basis it is accepted that no further assessment is currently required. At the time that other processing considerations necessitate the replacement of such equipment then consideration will of course need to be given in respect of the low NOx performance of replacement equipment.

BC020

The fitting of plastic curtains for the prevention of diffuse dust should be progressed. The date of re-scheduling is accepted.

BC021

NOx measurements should continue to be determined as now re-scheduled.

BC015

The proposal to install a single sampling point of the discharge to W1 is accepted. It is also accepted as proportionate to adopt a monthly sampling and testing regime.

A further update to confirm completion of the outstanding actions should be provided by GS Yuasa by 30th September 2019, unless otherwise agreed.
