### 4. Details of our assessment

#### Site report

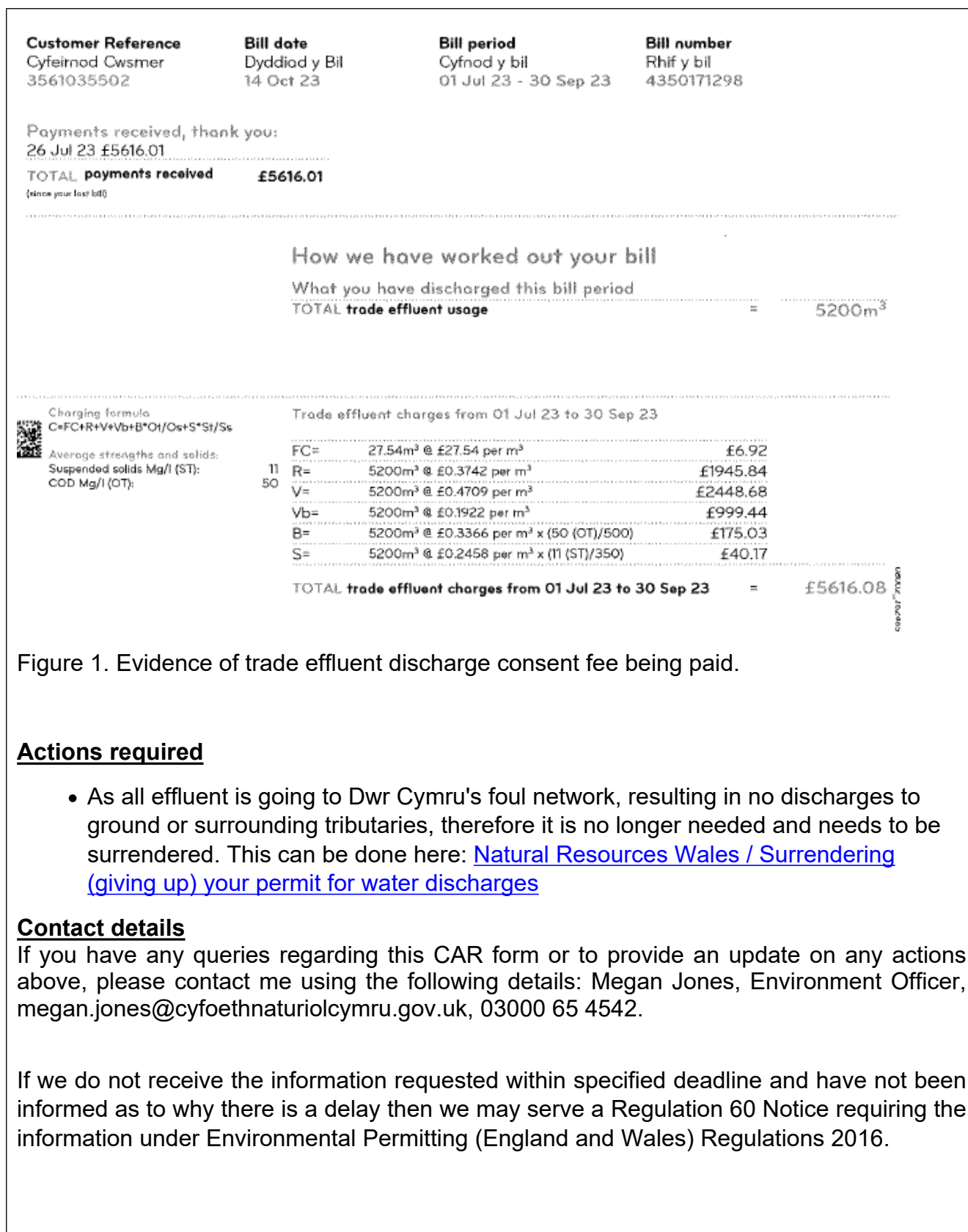


Figure 1. Evidence of trade effluent discharge consent fee being paid.

I (Megan Jones; Environment Officer) contacted Maria Godfrey (Team leader; CCBC) regarding the permit that they hold with NRW to discharge trade effluent/ leachate/ surface

water from Neuadd Wen Landfill Site to an un-named tributary of the River Rhymney (Permit Number: AN0245301). Upon discussion with Maria, it was identified that CCBC have been paying a discharge consent fee to DCWW for a substantial period of time (Fig. 1). Therefore, the permit is not necessary for this site as the effluent is connected to DCWW's network.
