3. What will happen next?

Any non-compliance we have identified and recorded on this form is an offence. It can result in criminal prosecution and/or suspension or revocation of your permit.

4. Details of our assessment

An unannounced inspection was carried out on 26 March 2024. The NRW officer was accompanied by the operator, Phillip Jones. The weather was dry and bright at the time of the visit, but there was heavy rain on the previous day.

Vehicles were being stored on land adjacent to the site, (formally known as the Northern Yard). No pollutants were seen from these vehicles. A permit variation is in the process of being sought which increases the site boundary into this area and the access road. The variation will also include the acceptance of scrap metal. NRW officer will make enquiries with permitting to determine the status of the application.

Investment has been made in the purchase of new depollution equipment to carry out treatment of End of Life Vehicles.

B4 Containment of stored Material Category 3 breach of conditions 2.1.1 Table 2.1.(Residual waste) and 5.4.1 Table 5.4 (b) (batteries)

Table 2.1

Residual waste from the treatment of vehicles was being stored in a different area to that shown in your site plan. Residual waste should also be stored in a bunded or sealed area large enough to contain 110% of the volume of the largest tank or container.

Table 5.4 (b)

Batteries were being stored outside within a container with an acid resistant base, but it did not have a lid to prevent the ingress of water.

Action: Residual waste arising from the depollution of vehicles must be stored as shown in the site plan and within a bunded or sealed area. Batteries must be stored indoors or with a lid to prevent the ingress of water
