4. Details of our assessment

This compliance assessment report (CAR) has been raised following a site visit on 1st May 2024 to meet the newly appointed Health, Safety and Environment Manager and Environmental Officer for the site.

The effluent treatment plant (ETP) area was visited, and the control panel was viewed which showed the following live data:

pH – 7.4

Temperature – 24°C

Suspended solids – 19mg/l

Flow – 11.3 m³/hr

The effluent plant manager confirmed that limits had been linked to the system for the above parameters which would then alarm on the panel if they went above or below the permit emission limit values (ELV's). The ETP manager also confirmed that they had implemented a new self-clean function on the turbidity probe using compressed air but are also manually checking the probe to ensure it has not become fouled and is reading correctly.

The emergency pits were empty and clean. The tank levels were all well within the capacity limits. The tank levels are continuing to be recorded on the white board and paper copies are completed and submitted to the new site Environmental Officer. The composite sample storage container and fridge were viewed which were clean and in order. A collection of sludge from the ETP was ongoing at the time of our visit and a slight odour could be detected. We walked around the outside of the rest of the site which was all in order. The door for incoming live birds was open but a lorry was about to drive in. The Health and Safety Manager explained that they are looking into installing automatic open/close on all the warehouse doors for incoming live birds and outgoing wastes from the process to further control odour and noise for the site. The site is looking to implement this towards the end of the summer.

Previous actions raised in CAR-NRW0043853:

1. *Confirm that the control panel is showing an alarm when measured effluent parameters fall outside the permitted limits.* This is now complete and demonstrated as discussed above.
2. *Submit in-house and third-party data to NRW for review to ensure in-house data is validated.* This was submitted on 07/05/24.
3. *Undertake a review of procedures to ensure visual checks at W2 and W3 are undertaken.* The management of effluent procedure (V3) now includes these checks. Data was also submitted to show the checks had been carried out weekly since 05/04/2024.
4. *Weekly check forms for W2 and W3 are submitted quarterly with the monitoring*

- 5. Send procedures concerning the removal of solids into a Dolav or similar container. The management of effluent procedure (V3) now includes these procedures in Section 8.*

Q1 2024 Monitoring - Water

The Q1 monitoring returns were received on 29th April 2024 for emissions from W1 emission point in compliance with the timescales stipulated in permit condition 4.2.3.

Emission limit values (ELV's) were breached for suspended solids and ammonia which were discussed and previously scored in CAR form NRW0043853.
