### 4. Details of our assessment

#### Notification of abnormal emissions:

NRW received a Schedule 1 part A notification on 9<sup>th</sup> April 2024 advising of a GUP outage had occurred. The GUP outage started at 10:17am on 8<sup>th</sup> April 2024 and was resolved at 11:50am on 9<sup>th</sup> April 2024. There was a potential release of an unquantifiable amount of landfill gas but no measurable environmental effects reported. The plant was restarted to stop the emission.

NRW received a Schedule 1 part B notification on 17<sup>th</sup> April 2024. This notification provided further information on the previously mentioned event. The GUP outage occurred due to Engine #3 being switched off for a 20k service and Engine #4 experiencing issues during start up. The flare did not start as the control panel also failed.

This incident is an emissions failure and a breach of Permit condition 2.2.1.2 due to the potential release of an unquantifiable amount of landfill gas. **This is considered a category 4 non compliance.**

This incident is a plant maintenance failure and breach of Permit condition 2.3.5 as the operator failed to maintain the plant in suitable working order. **This is considered a category 3 non compliance.**
