4. Details of our assessment

On Friday 10th May 2024 Officer Chris BURGE and Enforcement Apprentice Mark O'GORMAN attended at MJ Rubbish Removal Ltd Star Trading Estate, Ponthir, Newport, NP18 1PQ to conduct a planned first site inspection of permit DB3195CL, at the site officer meet with Matt JEAVONS site manager.

PERMIT OVERVIEW

Permit DB3195CL is a Standard rules SR2008 No1 - household, commercial and industrial waste transfer station.

Permitted wastes are limited to non-hazardous wastes and do not include hazardous wastes such as asbestos. The total quantity of waste that can be accepted at a site under these rules must be less than 75,000 tonnes a year. With the exception of specified waste, all bulking, transfer, or treatment of non-hazardous waste must be carried out inside a building. Wastes can be bulked up for disposal or recovery elsewhere and can be manually sorted or separated for recovery, but these rules will not allow any waste treatment activities such as screening and crushing. These rules will also not permit the burning of any wastes, either in the open, inside buildings or in any form of incinerator

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PERMIT INSPECTION

The site has a concrete impermeable service that is in a good condition during the time of inspection. There were no offensive odours and / or noises witnessed during the site inspection.

Photo 1 shows the concrete floor of the site.



On site, there were skips present full of mixed waste which are brought to the site and emptied on to the floor. The waste is then hand sorted by several staff into separate waste streams, this waste is then taken to larger permitted site for disposal.

Photo two shows skips under a covering where the waste is placed after sorting ready for disposal.



The site is fully bunded with a sealed drainage system. within the site there is a central drain which all surface runoff goes too, this is then stored with in an underground tank which is emptied by an appropriate contractor periodically.

Photo three shows the concrete bund at the entrance to the site.



The site is well organised, Officer Burge had no concerns at the time of the inspection.

Gwyn Jones is the Technically Competent Manger for the site and holds a valid WAMITAB certificate at the time of the inspection.
