4. Details of our assessment

This Compliance Assessment Report (CAR) has been issued in response to the submission of the Q1 (January - March) 2024 monitoring returns by Dunbia (UK) for activities at Cross Hands Business Park West, Cross Hands, Carmarthen under permit EPR-BU8002IT.

Q1 2024 Monitoring Returns

Emissions to water - *Water 1 / 24/04/2024*

The returns for reporting of sampling and analysis of emissions to water (other than sewer) to emission point W5 for Q1 2024 (01/01/2024 - 31/03/2024) were submitted on 24 April 2024.

Emissions to sewer - *Sewer1 / 24/04/2024*

The returns for reporting of sampling and analysis of emissions to sewer to emission point S1 for Q1 2024 were submitted on 24 April 2024.

- The monitoring data was sent within the Q1 reporting period, which is **compliant** with permit condition 4.2.3.
- The monitoring was conducted inside the Q1 monitoring period, which is **compliant** with permit condition 3.5.1.
- The monitoring returns submitted includes reporting of monitoring carried out in respect of the parameters and emission points specified in table S4.1 of schedule 4, which is **compliant** with the permit.
- Based on the reports submitted by the operator, all other emissions at the monitoring points appear **compliant** with the specified limits over the Q1 2024 reporting period.

SCHEDULE 5 NOTIFICATION SUBMISSIONS

On 12 February and 8 April 2024, the operator submitted schedule 5 notifications containing a part A and B detailing exceedances of ammonia at W5.

Table S3.2 point source emissions to water dictates that:

Ammonia shall not exceed:

- **0.25 mg/l**

On 26 January and 15 March 2024, ammonia was recorded at a value of 0.7mg/l and 0.3 mg/l respectively. These readings have exceeded the ELV specified in S3.2.

Investigation was carried out by the operator at the time of the exceedances. Potential issues have been highlighted with liquid seepage when skips are disconnected from the compactor. The operator is looking to upgrade the compactor for a skip that has a built-in compressing function, which could eliminate the need for disconnection and unwanted leakage. This has now been completed.

In accordance with NRW's non-compliance scoring guidance, the non-compliance scores for the breaches during Q1 2024 reporting period have been consolidated into one non-compliance score.

Compliance breach 1

In accordance with NRW's compliance scoring guidance, a non-compliance score of **C3** has been recorded against sub-criteria IR3A.

Schedule 5 - W5 sampling point

On 27 March 2024, an incident occurred involving the onsite gas housing station where a manoeuvring vehicle knocked into and damaged the mains gas cabin shelter. This damaged the pipework and allowed a small natural gas release. Once identified, the release was isolated whilst a repair was made to one part of the pressure relief valve damaged pipework.

The operator has detailed how it intends to install bollards near the gas station to prevent reoccurrence with accidental collision, and how the sub-contractor company intends to speak to all

drivers with regard to yard awareness. These actions have now been completed.

Compliance breach 2

In accordance with NRW's compliance scoring guidance, a non-compliance score of **C3** has been recorded against sub-criteria IR3B.
