4. Details of our assessment

In the early hours of the 23 June 2024, Natural Resources Wales (NRW) received a self-reporting WATPOL from Dŵr Cymru Welsh Water (DCWW) stating that a spill had occurred from Gwbert Sewage Pumping Station (SPS) during the evening of the 22 June 2024. It was later confirmed that the asset had spilled for a total of 5 hours and 15 minutes due to a blockage of fat within the rising main. DCWW confirmed that in addition to this blockage, they had also encountered significant fat, oil and grease (FOG) deposits in the SPS wet well. All

blockages were cleared by the 26 June 2024, with full flows restored at this time.

Under Condition 2 of Gwbert SPS's permit (BP0350201), a discharge may occur if the SPS is inoperative due to a blockage of the downstream sewer not due to the act or default of the Consent Holder, its agents, representatives, officers, employees or servants and it is not reasonably practicable to dispose of the sewage otherwise. The spill that occurred on the 22 June 2024 is suspected to have been in compliance with Condition 2.

This is not the first spill from Gwbert SPS where FOG has been highlighted as a contributing factor for the spill. A similar spill occurred on the 09 August 2023, following which, DCWW issued leaflets to local properties highlighting the problem of FOG within the sewer system. Whilst NRW are appreciative of the work that DCWW has already undertaken, it is clear that further work is required to reduce the amount of FOG entering the sewer system at Gwbert. In response to the latest spill therefore, NRW ask DCWW to confirm what actions will be taken to reduce the amount of FOG entering the sewer system at Gwbert, with associated timescales for completion, by no later than the **08 October 2024**.
