4. Details of our assessment

Routine site inspection of Little Mill Wastewater Treatment Works carried out by Environment Officer Peter Jones. On the day of the inspection, It was bright sunshine with no rain. There had been significant rain within the last 48 hours.

On entering the works, the general impression is one of neglect. Large areas of the works are

overgrown with Himalayan Balsam and brambles. Ash trees on the northern perimeter are overhanging the works. These look to be affected with Ash die back, there is a risk of falling branches and leaf litter impacting the operational effectiveness of the works. This vegetation should be cut back and managed.

From the inlet, the effluent passes through a macerator. From there the flow passes into a balancing tank. During storm conditions excess flows enter the storm tank, the storm tank was empty at the time of the inspection. The discharge from the storm tanks is not a permitted activity under permit AD0002501. Our records do not include an authorisation for a storm discharge at this location. Please provide an explanation on how the storm water contained in the storm tanks is managed.

From the balancing tank the flow moves into two primary settlement tanks (PST). One of the PST's has a tree growing on the baffle, please carry out maintenance work to remove any plant growth which may impact the operation of the works. Failing to maintain the works is a breach of permit condition 1.1.

From the PSTs the flow enters the filter beds, the rotating arms are distributing the effluent evenly. The filter medium is free of leaf litter and there is no moss or grass growth. The outlet channels from the filter beds are clean and the effluent is flowing on to the humous tanks. The brick work on the retaining walls of the filter beds is deteriorating, this should now be assessed, and repair work carried out as necessary.

There are two sets of humus tanks, the older rectangular pair, and the new circular humus tanks.

The final effluent point is clearly marked. The discharge point to the Berthin brook was checked and sewage fungus was evident on the substrate of the water course for approximately 1.5 metres downstream of the discharge. Please monitor this visual impact of the discharge on the receiving water and advise NRW how you can mitigate the impact of the discharge.

The site diary was checked, and all the relevant records were found to be up to date. The Mcert metres were checked, all had labels showing they had been calibrated.
