4. Details of our assessment

On 02 October 2024 a site inspection was undertaken by NRW Officers Sally Wakeford along with Mostyn Wall and Susan Francis from the Landfill Emissions Reduction Project Team.

The weather was dry and cloudy.

The site inspection was carried out in conjunction with a gas audit undertaken by Mostyn and Susan, which will be detailed under additional correspondence. This report does not mention any actions required relating to the gas infrastructure.

Site Walkover

A walkover of the site was undertaken, including areas of the landfill not previously visited. The infrastructure which has been identified is typically well secured & relatively easy to locate. Some of the labelling was difficult to read, however generally each asset was identifiable.

The main plan used during the inspection which contained the majority of the infrastructure was difficult to read, with many of the gas assets marked by a small blue dot and unnamed. This however is more visible when viewed on a computer screen – although still not labelled with asset references. I am aware that you continue to find further assets are the continues to be investigated.

ACTION: It would be advisable to compile a full infrastructure map showing all assets & each labelled.

Some of the manholes covering the gas infrastructure were starting to become overgrown.

ACTION: please ensure that the access to the infrastructure is maintained and are secure.

Station D

Investigations are still ongoing on the drainage system to Station D. Whilst investigations have been ongoing further infrastructure has been located, along with an input into the drainage system from an external source.

Weather is also a factor in delaying investigations, in that Manhole A, near Station D, requires over pumping direct to Station D so the connection can be surveyed by camera however the manhole fills too quickly following periods of rain to be maintained dry by over pumping to allow for the survey. A longer period of no rainfall is required to complete this.

Leachate Level

There are 15 Observation Wells (OW) throughout the site, which are dipping points for the leachate wells and provide the leachate level. These points have been monitored monthly since March. The levels vary from well to well. Following the inspection Cardiff CC provided

the leachate level dipping results from March, the results appear to show a downward trend in the leachate head to AOD.

The Conceptual Site Model for the site shows the leachate head should sit at 4.5m AOD. When starting monitoring the leachate level it was originally measuring as 8-9m AOD, with a downward trend over summer, the results on average are sitting around the 6m mark currently. The downward trend throughout the year to date is promising, and shows the improvements made by Cardiff CC at the site to reduce the leachate level across the landfill.

Actions from previous CAR form:

Following the last inspection on 06/03/2024 and detailed in CAR_NRW0043878 there were a number of actions which required action. Copied below, they include an update provided by the Operator.

- Closure Report/Aftercare Plan to be updated to include maintenance regime and site operations – ***Being updated.***
- Update to HRA following completion of 6 months monitoring – ***Monitoring is complete – HRA with Consultant.***
- Submission of permit variation application following completion of updated HRA. – ***See above.***
- Continue to investigate the root cause of why Pumping Station D leachate collection tank does not receive leachate to its full capacity or suggest alternatives which will provide the same functionality as the original design of the landfill – ***Additional investigations are continuing into the drainage system feeding station D, issues with rainfall hindering progress.***
- Undertake a DSEAR Risk Assessment and implement findings. – ***Complete.***
- Confirm the level of leachate within the landfill – ***Complete.***
- Provide an annual report/summary of the monitoring – ***ongoing.***

Ongoing Actions:

- Closure Report/Aftercare Plan to be updated to include maintenance regime and site operations.
- Update to HRA following completion of 6 months monitoring.
- Submission of permit variation application following completion of updated HRA.
- Continue to investigate the root cause of Pumping Station D issues.
- Provide an annual report/summary of the monitoring.
- It would be advisable to compile a full infrastructure map showing all assets & each labelled to easily identify them (should be part of the updated Closure & Aftercare Plan).
- Please ensure that the access to the infrastructure is maintained and they are secure (will be part of the maintenance schedule in the updated Closure & Aftercare Plan).
