4. Details of our assessment

This Compliance Assessment Report relates to a site inspection of Cuckoo Mill Pumping Station on the 15th October 2024. It was drizzling on and off at the time of the visit and there had been rainfall in the days preceding.

This CAR form relates to the permitted Cuckoo Mill SPS Emergency Overflow BE0075603 as defined in the permit conditions. There is also a permit in place for Storm Discharge from the SPS. I

will complete a separate CAR form for that discharge/ permit number. As the EO permit was issued in 1992 we would recommend consolidation of the permit with the Storm permit at Cuckoo Mill SPS, if the opportunity arises.

We inspected the wet well which had three rising mains and storage tank which were at a low level during the inspection and the sample point. You told us that in the case of an emergency, flows would rise to the top of the chamber and overflow through the pipe into the channel where a CopaSac was fitted on the end of the pipe to provide additional screening to the discharge.

As a result of a pollution incident from Cuckoo Mill SPS in January 2023 and action from CAR form CAR_NRW0040986 you provided the following calculation to estimate the DWF storage available during a June day.

Storage volume available (combining wet-well and storage tank) = 342.9m³.

Flow volume over a 12hr period (based on an estimated DWF of 4.33l/s) = 187m³.

We discussed this with you during the inspection but we did not measure the storage capacity due to its inaccessible location underground.

We noted three pumps during the inspection. You informed us that the pumps at the SPS were duty assist and standby and are alarmed as permitted. You also told us that there is a generator on site.

The permitted discharge point for the Emergency Overflow is to the River Llan at SS 63943 99269. We did not inspect the discharge point on this occasion due to the vegetation and wire fencing.
