IMPOUNDMENT

This report is in reference to the Impoundment Licence 23/65/16/68

The site was visited on the 2.10.2024 by Environment Officers Swyn Spencer and Laura Jones. Not all conditions in the licence are mentioned in this report. You should always familiarise yourselves with the two licences in full to ensure compliance.

1. NAME OF INLAND WATER TO BE IMPOUNDED

DHG Hydro Limited is on an inland river known as the Afon Hwch at Llanberis, Gwynedd.

2. POINT OF IMPOUNDMENT – Point A:

As noted in the impoundment licence. National Grid Reference SH 57832 59308. Correct.
Compliant.

3. MANNER AND EXTENT OF IMPOUNDMENT:

Measurements were taken on another compliance visit during 21.06.2017, of the Hands off Flow weir and intake screen. **These were within licence conditions at the time. Future visits will re – check.**

See CAR form CAR_NRW0045386 which explains work needed on the intake screen.

4. FURTHER CONDITIONS:

Condition 4.3 was assessed:

“The Licence Holder shall maintain the intake weir to prevent leakage and to be free from obstruction at all times”.

During 2.10.2024 visit there were no blockages. The Hof (Hands Off Flow) was clear.

Compliant.

However looking at our records system from this site, there has previously been evidence of blockage on the HOF in 2015 whilst the scheme was abstracting. However a CAR form was not sent at the time of the visit in 2015. Had one been sent it would have been a clear breach of compliance.

Please continue to keep the sediment directly behind the compensation flow area / Hof area clear and ensure that you maintain it regularly. Condition 4.1 states;

‘The Licence Holder shall maintain a flow of at least 120 litres per second downstream of the impoundment licence at all times’.

Keeping Hof clear will contribute to this being achieved. Through compliance with the rates of

abstraction and maintenance as per licences, the in river ecology is also protected.
