4. Details of our assessment

Moorland Environmental Site Visit – (EPR/ AB3132AH) – 15/01/2025

Environment Officers Craig Coleman, Gareth Morris, and Carriers and Brokers Officer Andrew Prestt visited the Moorland Environmental facility at Portmanmoor Road Industrial Estate, Cardiff CF24 5HB on 15/01/2025 to undertake a routine site inspection to assess compliance with environmental permit (AB3132AH, SR2008 No05). A hazardous waste compliance visit was also completed at the same time as this visit which will be attached to this CAR form. Mr Steve Scammell a site manager was on site to meet us and discuss the site operations with us.

Since their last inspection Moorland Environmental has relinquished the lease on Unit 44, with their operation now solely confined to Unit 43. This has no impact on their permit boundary as the space at Unit 44 was only ever utilised to store products for their wider business.

Moorland Environmental holds an SR2008 No05 HCI waste transfer station and asbestos storage v7.1 permit. This allows them to store multiple waste codes, but Moorland Environmental's core business focuses on asbestos and as such the site only accepts 17 06 01* (Insulation materials containing asbestos) and 17 06 05* (construction material containing asbestos).

W1A - General Management

Mr Harry Scammell is the current Technically Competent Manager for the Moorland Environmental. He has begun the transfer of responsibility of being the sites technically competent manager to Mr Steve Scammell who is currently certified to WAMITAB level 3.

The sites Environmental Management System was displayed in an easily visible location for all staff to have access to.

The site benefits from 7ft railings that surround the site. The site also has a CCTV system that is monitored off site by a third-party company when the Moorland Environmental is closed.

W2A - Permitted activities

At the time of the site visit, Moorland Environmental were storing multiple skips on site. These were mostly roll on roll off skips. All the skips were in good condition and well maintained.

W2C - Operating techniques

The site only accepts two waste codes. 17 06 01* (Insulation materials containing asbestos) and 17 06 05* (construction material containing asbestos). As such there is no mixing of wastes taking place as all of the asbestos imported to site is done so double bagged either kept within the skip that it was imported onto site in, or carried to an appropriate skip for bulking and onward transport for disposal.

W2D - The site

The site operates fully within the permit boundaries. All skips are stored on an impenetrable surface with adequate spacing between each to allow for ease of movement when transportation of the waste for disposal is required.

W2E – Waste acceptance

As previously mentioned. The site only accepts one waste stream. Whilst on site a hazardous waste

assessment was undertaken which includes a paperwork exercise of reviewing the consignments notes that was legally required under the Hazardous Waste (Wales) Regulation 2005. All consignment notes reviewed were completed correctly.
