4. Details of our assessment

This Compliance Assessment Report (CAR) has been raised in relation to the Q4 2024 monitoring returns and annual report.

Q4 Monitoring Returns Air

The Q4 monitoring returns were received on 20th January 2024 for discharges from A6, A7 and A15 emission points in compliance with permit condition 3.3.1.

There are no permitted Emission Limit Values (ELVs) for these emission points.

Q4 Monitoring Returns Water

The Q4 monitoring returns were received on 20th January 2025 for discharges from W2 emission point in compliance with permit condition 4.2.3. Schedule 5 notifications were received for breaches of the total suspended solids limit for the following dates;

04/12/24 – 117mg/l

05/12/24 – 113mg/l

The permitted limit for suspended solids is 80mg/l.

IR3A Emissions to water, air or land. Permit Condition 3.1.2 Schedule 3(b) Table S3.2. C3

Action

Coleshill Mill was shut down for 30 hours to reduce the hydraulic load on the effluent plant and to assist in the settlement of solids. The coagulant dosing and effluent re-circulation was also increased. These actions resulted in the effluent coming back into consent by 06/12/24. As Coleshill Mill is ceasing production and the effluent plant being emptied and

decommissioned no further actions are required for this breach.

All other reported parameters were in compliance with the ELV's applied by Permit Condition 3.3.1, Schedule 3(b), Table S3.2.

Q4 Waste Returns

The Q4 waste returns were received on 20th January 2025 in compliance with Permit Condition 4.2.5. The waste returns were reviewed and all waste accepted was in compliance with Permit Condition 2.3.2, schedule 2, table S2.1.

Annual Returns

Annual monitoring for emissions to water was received on 27th January 2025 as required by Permit Condition 4.2.3. The limits are listed in Schedule 4(b) Table S4.1. All reported parameters were in compliance with the ELV's in Schedule 3(b), Table S3.3.

A Priority Hazardous Pollutants screen is required to be conducted annually by Permit Condition 3.3.1, Schedule 3(b), Table S3.2 for emissions to water. This was provided on 20th January 2025.

An annual performance report has been submitted as required by Permit Condition 4.2.2. including the parameters detailed in Schedule 4(b) Table S4.2. The report satisfies this condition.

Energy usage (MWh/t) has increased from 2023 but overall energy used was lower.

There was a slight increase in water used and discharged (m3/t) from 2023.

Coleshill Mill ceased production in December 2024 and the Mill completely closed at the end of January 2025.
