4. Details of our assessment

Cwm Rhondda Waste Management Services Limited Site Visit, Rhondda Cynon Taf (WP3797ED) – 13/02/2025

Waste Regulation Officer Gareth Morris accompanied by Senior Waste Regulation Officer; Craig Coleman and Carriers and Brookers Officer; Andrew Prestt visited Cwm Rhondda Waste Management Services Limited, Albion Works, Dinas Isaf Road, Williamstown, Rhondda Cynon Taf, CF40 1NE on 13/02/2025 to conduct a routine site inspection and to assess compliance with environmental permit; WP3797ED

The operator holds a bespoke environmental permit (A13)

The site is a transfer station which receives a number of waste streams.

On arrival at site, we were met by two site attendants who cocontacted the site owner, who then accompanied us around the permitted site.

Weather on day of inspection, was clear, dry with little wind.

Breaches Recorded

W1A- General Management

Route Cause Breach 1.1.1

Permit Condition 1.1.1 (a) (iii) states: *No waste management operations shall be authorised by this license unless: (a) Specified in and undertaken in accordance with the limitations in the following table (iii) Maximum period of storage for degradable household and industrial wastes (non-hazardous) shall be 48 hours*

While conducting my inspection of the permitted site, a large amount of mixed household waste (20 03 01) was piled up against the permitted site boundary fence. The boundary fence was bowing significantly due to the large amount of waste stored against it. A busy two-lane road runs parallel to

the permitted site boundary fencing. If the boundary fencing were to give way due to the amount of waste stored against it, it would cause a substantial pollution incident and cause a major accident.

Action: I informed the permit holder, that all the waste stored against the boundary fencing would need to be moved immediately. The permit holder agreed that the waste needed to be moved as it posed a substantial risk. The permit holder informed me that the waste would be moved by themselves away from the boundary fencing and then collected by a registered waste collector.

I informed the permit holder, that they would receive a Category Three (3) breach for this breach of the permit condition.

Areas assessed as compliant and other comments can be found below.

W1A- General Management

Permit Condition 1.4.1 states: *Whenever the site is open to receive or dispatch wastes, or is carrying out any of the specified waste management operations, it shall be supervised by at least one member of staff who is suitably trained and fully conversant with the requirements of the license.*

While on site, the permit holder, produced a copy of their up-to-date WAMITAB certificate. I was also informed that the permit holder attends the permitted site regularly.

Permit Condition 3.2.1 states: *Site security systems shall be provided at all times during the subsistence of this license, the objective of which shall be to prevent access by humans, and livestock, which is not authorised either by the License Holder or under legal powers of entry.*

The permitted site benefited from a robust security system made up of 7ft railings and lockable gates. The site also has a 24/7 CCTV system.

W4A-Records

Permit Condition 1.4.2 states: *A copy of this license shall be kept available on site for reference when*

required by all site staff carrying out work under the requirements of the license.

The permit holder showed me a copy of both their permit and environmental management system (EMS).

W2C-Operating Techniques

Permit Condition 4.4.1 states: ***All wastes shall be received, inspected, accepted, or rejected, and recorded in accordance with the standards specified in Table 4.4.***

The site accepts a number of waste codes. All waste was correctly segregated. There was no evidence of mixed/contaminated waste within any of the waste storage containers.

W2E- Waste Acceptance

Permit Condition 4.4.1 states: *All wastes shall be received, inspected, accepted, or rejected, and recorded in accordance with the standards specified in Table 4.4. All wastes received at the site (I) Shall be inspected on receipt to confirm their description and composition against the relevant waste transfer note and other accompanying documentation.*

The site accepts a number of waste codes. Quarterly returns for the previous quarter have been received on time. The Quarterly returns have been checked against the sites waste codes and are correct.

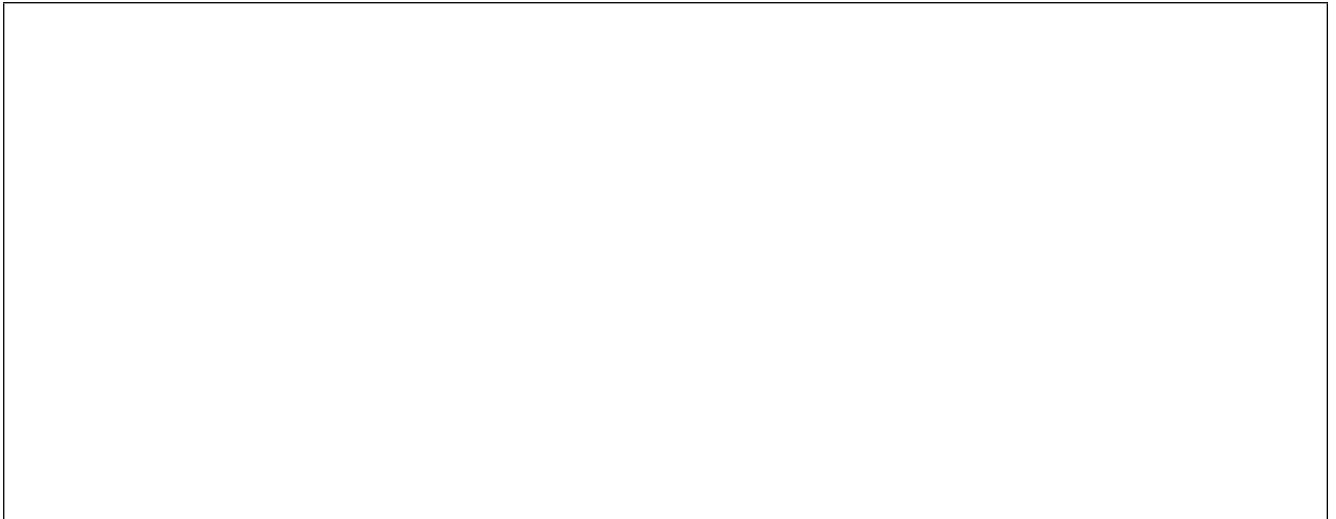
