The report(s) submission was not made inside the reporting window which does not represent compliance the environmental permit.

The report(s) submitted include a summary report of the previous year's progress against Environmental Management System improvement targets which represents compliance the environmental permit.

Condition 4.1.5 of the environmental permit has been breached as the report was submitted late.

This breach has been scored a C4 non-compliance category – A non-compliance at a regulated site that cannot foreseeably have any impact on the environment, people and/or property.

Review of and progress against waste and water audits

Environmental permit condition 2.4.1.2 states:

[The operator shall] carry out periodic waste minimisation audits and water use efficiency audits. If such an audit has not been carried out in the 2 years prior to the issue of this Permit, then the first such audit shall take place within 2 years of its issue. The methodology used and an action plan for increasing the efficiency of the use of raw materials or water shall be submitted to the Agency within 2 months of completion of each such audit and a review of the audit and a description of progress made against the action plan shall be submitted to the Agency at least every 4 years thereafter

Report(s) for condition 2.4.1.2 were submitted via email on 19/02/25.

The last report for condition 2.4.1.2 was submitted in December 2020

The report(s) submission was not made inside the reporting window (December 2024) which does not represent compliance the environmental permit.

The report(s) submitted include a review of the waste minimisation audits and water use efficiency audits and a description of progress made against the action plan which represents compliance the environmental permit.

Condition 2.4.1.2 of the environmental permit has been breached as the report was submitted late.

This breach has been scored a C4 non-compliance category – A non-compliance at a regulated site that cannot foreseeably have any impact on the environment, people and/or property.

Review of accident management plan

Condition 2.8.1 of the environmental permit states:

The Operator shall maintain and implement when necessary the accident management plan submitted or described in Section 2.8 of the Application. The plan shall be reviewed at least every 2 years or as soon as practicable after an accident, whichever is the earlier, and the Agency notified of the results of the review within 2 months of its completion.

Notification for condition 2.8.1 was submitted via email on 19/02/25.

The last notification for condition 2.8.1 was received in July 2020.

The notification submission was not made inside the notification window (July 2024) which does not represent compliance the environmental permit.

The notification includes the results of the review which represents compliance the

environmental permit.

Condition 2.8.1 of the environmental permit has been breached as the report was submitted late.

This breach has been scored a C4 non-compliance category – A non-compliance at a regulated site that cannot foreseeably have any impact on the environment, people and/or property.
