CONTROL OF POLLUTION ACT 1974 LICENCE TO DISPOSE OF WASTE

The Newport Borough Council in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by the Control of Pollution Act 1974, hereby license:-

Gethin Davies & Son

Croescarneinion Farm, Rhiwderin, Gwent

herein after called the "licence holder" to operate a landfill site (herein after called "the facility") on land at Croescarneinion Farm, Rhiwderin

grid reference: NG 5000 and 3277

which is edged in red on the drawings attached to this licence, being land occupied by the licence holder.

This licence is granted subject to the conditions set out in the schedule attached hereto.

NOTES

These notes are for general guidance only and they do not constitute an authoritative statement of the law.

1. This licence relates only to the requirements of the Control of Pollution Act 1974 for the deposit of waste and the use of plant or equipment subject to the conditions set out in the Schedule and does not constitute a consent required by other legislation. In particular it is the responsibility of the licence holder to comply with any requirements of the HEALTH AND SAFETY at WORK etc., ACT 1974, the RADIOACTIVE SUBSTANCES ACT 1960, the TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACTS, BUILDING REGULATIONS, and ALL RELEVANT WATER PROTECTION and ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH legislation.

All discharges to sewer and watercourse have to meet the requirements of the Water Authority. Any diversion or other changes will also require Water Authority approval.

2. If the licence holder ceases to occupy the land specified above, then he may transfer the licence to the new occupier after giving notice to the Waste Disposal Authority who has the right to decline to accept the new licence holder.

3. If the licence holder wishes to cancel this licence, he must return it to the Waste Disposal Authority together with a notice stating that he no longer requires the licence. Cancellation of the licence will not affect any outstanding liability of the licence holder under the conditions of the licence.

Contravention of Licence Conditions

Your attention is drawn to the provisions of Sections 3, 9 and 16 of the Control of Pollution Act 1974. A brief resume is included below.

Section 3

Prohibits under penalty the deposit of waste, or the use of plant or equipment, otherwise than in accordance with the terms of a licence. This Section applies to all the conditions contained herein, including any which may be the subject of appeal to the Secretary of State under Section 10 of the Act.

Any deposit which takes place without compliance with all the licence conditions may lead to prosecution under this Section.

Section 9

Non compliance with any licence conditions may lead to the revocation of this licence.

Section 16

The licensing authority is empowered to require the removal of any controlled waste deposited in circumstances where any of the conditions contained in this licence are not being complied with.

Penalties under Section 3

A person who contravenes Section 3 subsection (1) shall, subject to subsection (4), be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine of an amount not exceeding scale 5 (currently £2000), or on conviction on indictment to imprisonment for a term not exceeding two years or a fine or both.

SCHEDULE A : TYPES OF WASTE

The type and quantity of waste deposited daily at the site shall not exceed 400 tonnes of clean soil/sub soil only.

SCHEDULE B: GENERAL CONDITIONS

Croescarneinion Farm, Rhiwderin, Gwent

1. Waste material shall only be accepted at the site between the hours of 8 am - 5 pm, Mondays to Fridays, and on Saturday between the hours of 8 am and 12.30 pm. No waste shall be accepted on Sundays or Bank Holidays.
2. The site road shall be maintained to the reasonable satisfaction of the Waste Disposal Authority.
3. Suitable wheel-cleaning equipment shall be provided. Such equipment shall be properly maintained and used.
4. A site control office shall be provided, and the site shall be adequately manned and supervised during working hours.
5. A site identification board of durable material and finish shall be displayed at the site entrance, showing the hours when the site is open and giving the name, address and telephone number of the operator (or his local agent) and of the Waste Disposal authority responsible for issuing the site licence.
6. Water Courses on the site shall be diverted, culverted, or otherwise protected to the reasonable satisfaction of the Waste Disposal Authority.
7. Suitable means shall be provided for diverting surface water drainage from surrounding higher land from the site.
8. Subsidiary roads shall be maintained to a reasonable standard.
9. Suitable facilities shall be provided for the storage and maintenance of equipment used on the site.
10. All gates and fencing shall be maintained to the reasonable satisfaction of the Waste Disposal Authority, and all reasonable precautions shall be taken to prevent unauthorised access to the site.
11. Solid waste shall be compacted and formed into a layer as soon as possible after deposit and not later than the end of the working day on which the waste is received. The depth of a layer of waste shall not after initial compaction exceed 2.5 metres (8 ft).
12. Waste shall either;
 - a) be deposited on the surface of the site behind the face and partially compacted by a tractor or other compacting machine before being pushed over the face;
 - or b) be deposited on the ground forming the base of the site or on a previous layer in front of the face and shall be formed into a compacted layer by being pushed upwards and driven over by a tractor or other compacting machine.
13. Before covering, working faces and flanks shall be compacted to form gradients not steeper than 1:3.

14. Effective precautions shall be taken to deal with any vermin or insects on the site.
15. The terms of the site licence shall be made known to any person who is given responsibility for the management or control of the site, and a copy of this shall be displayed at the site control office.
16. In dry weather, all roads shall be sprayed with water to suppress dust.
17. Top soil stripping shall be carried out in stages and only to the extent necessary to maintain a reasonably adequate area for landfilling at any one time. Top soil thus stripped shall be retained on site for use as final cover.
18. Each layer of waste and covering material shall be laid to a fall to encourage surface water to run off.
19. Completed areas of landfilling shall be graded and maintained in a tidy condition and action shall be taken to control or destroy weeds.
20. Any temporary cessation for a period in excess of three months shall be notified to the Waste Disposal Authority, and not less than 14 days notice shall be given to the Waste Disposal Authority of the date on which landfilling is to re-commence.
21. A suitably qualified person shall oversee all site preparation works and certify that they meet the general requirements of the licence. Adequate security and supervision shall be provided to prevent non-authorized waste and out of hours tipping.
22. A working plan must be submitted and the site must be prepared to the standards set out in that plan before any materials are tipped.
23. Site roads and public highway to be kept clear of deposits of mud soil.
24. The issue of this licence does not lessen the holder's obligation to comply with all other statutory duties imposed by other legislation.
25. This licence shall expire on 31 December 1992.
