4. Details of our assessment

This report details the site visit made on the 18 March 2025 to Recresco Limited, permit reference number EPR-DB3797TC.

Natural Resources Wales (NRW) Officers Carla CURTIS and Greg GARDNER attended site at 10:15 to conduct a routine inspection, the Depot Manager accompanied officers around the site. The site has recently installed a new gas dryer to replace the older diesel dryer being used as part of their operations. The facility had previously attracted reports from local residents of strong fuel/diesel odours believed to be coming from the Recresco site, NRW has not substantiated any of these odours. At the time of the inspection the new gas dryer was running well and NRW Officers did not witness any offensive odours. No odour reports have been received by NRW since the installation of the new gas dryer.

Action – Please can you update and submit your Environment Management System to reflect the changes made to operations on site with the installation of the gas dryer.

The following observations were made during the site visit. The site was fully operational at the time of inspection, NRW Officers noted that all the glass waste(s) that were stored outside on the previous visit (08/01/25), have now been removed and is being stored inside as the permit requires.

WASTE ACTIVITIES

All the waste and product storage bays were all clearly labelled.

DRAINAGE SYSTEM

The drainage is working efficiently and is regularly maintained.

SITE INFRASTRUCTURE

The flooring on site was in good condition. General housekeeping on site was maintained to a good standard and no causes for concern were identified. There was no excessive noise along with no offensive odours witnessed by NRW Officers especially near the dryer section of the site which has now changed from Diesel to gas with effect from 11 March 2025.

TECHNICAL COMPETENCY

The site TCM is John Maddox. the certificate expires 25 November 2026.
