4. Details of our assessment

The abstraction licence to abstract water from inland water (river) known as the Afon Gamallt at Hafod Ysptyty, Cwm Teigl, Blaenau Ffestiniog, Gwynedd was inspected by Laura Jones from the Conwy Environment Management team and Sioned Jones from the Dwyfor and Meirionnydd Environment Management team on the 6th June 2025 and met with the site Manager Liam Brown from Green Earth Hydro. Unfortunately the flows were too high to cross the river to visit the impoundment, but we did visit the outfall and turbine house

Power production

All year

4. Maximum Quantities of Water to be Abstracted

12528 cubic meters per day

3,507,840 cubic meters per year

At an instantaneous rate not exceeding 145 litres per second.

4. Means of Measurement of Water Abstracted

The licence holder shall determine the quantity of water abstracted by reference to the kilowatt-hours generated, as measured by a kilowatt-hours meter multiplied by the conversion factor determined using a calculation checklist attached to the licence.

The licence holder shall retain supporting documentation relating to details of the methodology and calculations used to convert electricity generated to the quantities abstracted and make them available to the agency on request

4. Records

The licence holder shall record readings of the electrical output and the corresponding

quantity of water abstracted at the same time each week, as determined using the calculation checklist attached to the licence.

No issues were identified, returns have been received by Natural Resources Wales and abstraction quantities are within the permitted amounts.

The licence holder shall return all of the water abstracted in pursuance of this licence to the Afon Gamallt at National Grid Reference SH 72190 43295
