3. What will happen next?

Any non-compliance we have identified and recorded on this form is an offence. It can result in criminal prosecution and/or suspension or revocation of your permit.

At this time, we do not intend to take any further action.

4. Details of our assessment

Arranged site inspection to determine current progress with steps required under the Regulation 36 notice for several non compliances as identified in *CAR_NRW0047873*, undertaken by Michael Edwards of Natural Resources Wales and Simon Pearson of Mid and West Wales Fire Rescue Service accompanied on site by permit operator.

W1 - Waste Management - Ongoing

During the previous inspection the site was scored a **category 2 breach** for failure to comply with the requirements of **condition 1.1.1 (a)** - by failing to adhere to a management system that identifies and minimises the risk to the environment by the operations conducted on site.

Following on from the previous inspection, consultants have confirmed with NRW that they will be working towards developing a new Environmental Management System (EMS) in line with the current working practices of the site and a Fire Prevention and Mitigation Plan (FPMP).

W2 - Waste Operations

W2A - Permitted Activities

Operations on site are limited to those listed under **condition 2.1.1** and specified in **Table 2.1**.

W2C - Operating Techniques - Ongoing

During the previous inspections, officers have noted a significant volume of waste stored at the rear of the building on an area of impermeable surface which had been in situ in excess

of the allowed storage period under **condition 2.1.1**.

Improvements have been made by the operator with a reduction in the waste directly to the rear of the main building, with the expectation to incorporate a 6m fire break between the building and the stockpiles before continuing to remove the waste as required under the notice and FPMP.



Concerns were raised previously in relation to the storage of oil in areas of hardstanding and several smaller oil spills around the yard resulting in a **Category 2 breach of condition 2.3.1**

During this inspection officers did not note any oils stored on areas of hardstanding, however the site still seems to be experiencing issues with oils spill throughout the permitted area that were in the process of being cleared at the time of the inspection.





W3 - Waste Emissions and Monitoring

W3G - Fires - Ongoing

During the previous inspection, wastes were not stored in accordance with the approved FPMP which resulted in a **category 2 breach of condition 3.4.1**.

The site has reduced the volume of waste from the previous inspection and the yard was more accessible with the access track as described in the FPMP in place, however as discussed during the inspection the volume of waste still remaining and its current storage may pose a health and safety risk for the Fire Rescue Service in the event of an incident.
