4. Details of our assessment

A routine site inspection was undertaken on Thursday 03 July 2025 to assess compliance against Permit No: RP3098FM held by Ammanford Recycling Limited. The permit consists of two standard rules sets: SR2008 No21 (metal recycling site) and SR2008 No20 (vehicle storage, depollution & dismantling (authorised treatment facility)). Present at the time of the inspection were: David Ellar and Ed Davies (Natural Resources Wales) and the Compliance Manager and Site Manager (Ammanford Recycling Limited).

The weather was fine and dry.

Permit breaches identified:

No permit breaches were observed during the inspection.

General Observations:

NRW officers were accompanied around the site by ARL compliance Manager and Site Manager. The site was generally clean, tidy, well organised and good segregation of waste types was observed. The yard area was mostly clear, oily waste was in oily waste storage areas, ELV generated waste was correctly scored, scrap metal was segregated and bunds were clear of debris.

Some areas of the treatment pad were badly worn and damaged, the Compliance Manager informed officers that they were already aware of this, they said that the areas were still impermeable due to the thickness of the concrete, and they had already been identified on their daily checks. Waste had been removed from these areas and they were due to be repaired as per their maintenance schedule. It was estimated that the repairs would be complete within the next couple of months and certainly before winter.

ACTION: Repair concrete pad as required and send photographic evidence to NRW to show works.

EMS:

Whilst the site has an EMS that covers the ELV operation of the site, it does not yet fully reflect the recent variation to the permit and the 2 rule sets. This was discussed during our last visit on the 18/03/25. ARL will amend the current EMS to reflect the recent changes to the permit. Both rule sets can be covered in the one document but separation of different requirements must be clearly laid out. The Compliance Manager confirmed the review was underway and they would chase the consultant.

ACTION: Submit new EMS to NRW for review.

ELV Depollution:

The ELV depollution process was inspected. The depollution area has been upgraded with new kit and waste storage. The depollution process is clearly defined in the EMS and copies of the process, flow diagrams and supporting information are made visible on the wall of the depollution area for staff to refer to. Liquid waste is removed from ELVs via vacuum pipe and feed directly into bunded tanks in a bunded area and batteries are stored in cages in the building. The bunds were clear of waste/rain water and good condition.

Evidence of good practice was observed, and it was found that the ELV depollution process was compliant with the permit.

TCM:

Mr David Andrew Evans is TCM for the site and holds MROC1 issued 13/01/2023, which is the relevant qualification for SR2008 No21 (metal recycling site). The relevant qualification for SR2008 No20 (vehicle storage, depollution & dismantling (authorised treatment) facility) is MROC2 which is not held by Mr Evans. This was discussed with Mr Evans during our previous visit and an action was set to Contact training provider to ensure correct level of TCM certification is in place. This was done and the correct course was identified, Mr Evans is in the process booking on the course.

ACTION ONLY: Book onto and gain the appropriate WAMITAB qualification.
