4. Details of our assessment

Incident Report

This report details an incident report made by a member of the public to Natural Resources Wales (NRW) (WIRS 2502395) on the 06/03/2025 at 15:19 for a Dŵr Cymru Welsh Water (DCWW) permitted asset Tanybryn CSO Risca, Pontymister, NP11 6JQ, permit reference number EPR- AD0002801.

General Observations

This site is a Combined Sewage Overflow (CSO) serving a combined sewer line in the Pontymister area of Caerphilly County Borough Council (CCBC). The CSO discharges via a storm overflow outfall to the River Ebbw at ST2552589580.

The asset is permitted to discharge storm sewage only via the point of discharge (ST2552589580) at an overflow setting of 589l/s. The maximum size of solid matter permitted for discharge is no greater than 6 mm in more than 1 dimension, with a screen aperture size of 6mm x 6mm required to be in place to ensure this. Monitoring frequency should be whenever a discharge occurs, with event duration monitoring in place at the point of overflow.

The site was operational at the time of the report.

Investigation Summary

NRW received an incident report on the 06/03/2025 from a member of the public who stated that they had witnessed sewage discharging from an outfall pipe in to the Ebbw, with sanitary products around the outfall and grey water seen for 15 yards downstream. On confirming the location, it was noted that the outfall in question was a DCWW permitted CSO (Tanybryn). This CSO was recently subject to a separate report on the 11/12/2024, with DCWW work continuing at the time of this second report. It is noted that continued ammonia sampling by DCWW had shown negligible impact as of the time of this report.

It was confirmed by the DCWW Gwent Network Manager that further water ingress issues were found on the WVTS so additional repairs will be needed upstream. It was confirmed sampling will re-commence as a precaution.

The issue with the Western Valley Trunk Sewer is extremely complex due to the diameter of the sewer therefore DCWW arranged for a Sonar Survey to be completed to identify any restrictions through thermal imaging. Over pumping was set up on the network to reduce spill and jetting works continued

I conducted a site visit to Tanybryn CSO on 18/03/2025 to inspect visual quality of discharge if occurring. No discharge was observed at the time of the visit, with no debris present. Intermittent sewage odour but not persistent. Over pumping was observed to be in place on opposite bank. No downstream impact was observed.

Flow management, monitoring and continual updates were received from DCWW until the repair works were completed on the 27/04/2025. It was noted that a cleanse of the network would continue downstream of Tanybryn, but at the time of this update DCWW had removed approximately 5 tonnes of river bedding from the trunk sewer.

A no impact claim was submitted and accepted to reflect this incident, and it was closed as an event by NRW.
